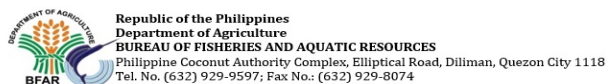

**Remarks/Market Observations:**

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors for the month of July:

- Unloadings of fresh marine commodities, particularly local-fresh galunggong were sufficient at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) for the 1st and 2nd week of the month. For the 3rd and 4th week, limited volumes of supply was observed at the Fish Port due to unfavorable weather condition brought by Typhoon "Fabian" and Southwest Monsoon or "Habagat". The actual price for this month is at Php113-213.00/kg.
- Imported-frozen Galunggong continues to have available supply at the Navotas Fish Port this month. Prevailing wholesale prices increased in the later part of the month as supplies of local-fresh galunggong decreased. The demand for imported-frozen galunggong increased as it is considered as substitute commodity for its local variant.
- Meanwhile, wholesale prices of Bangus and Tilapia remained stable due to its steady supply and demand in the first two (2) weeks of the month. There is a slight increased in the wholesale price as demand shifted to aquaculture commodities due to low supply of marine commodities at the Navotas Fish Port.
- Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Laguna, Bulacan, Pangasinan, Batangas
  - Tilapia - Batangas
  - Local-fresh galunggong - Northern Palawan
  - Imported-frozen Galunggong - China
- As the COVID-19 pandemic remain in place, the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) continues to ensure the implementation of precautionary safety measures (eg, wearing of face masks and face shields as well as white shirt and white boots; and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) to avoid further spread of the virus at Navotas Fish Port.
