With the continuous sufficient availability of its local-fresh variant, there remains to be no medium-sized Imported-frozen Galunggong noted in all monitored retail markets. However, limited volumes of large-sized Imported-frozen Galunggong were recorded in some monitored markets. The differences in price may have been caused by the varying sources of supplies in the monitored markets.
