Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Generally, low volumes of supplies for fresh marine commodities were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. This may attributed to the following:
 - Occurrence of full moon on 22 August, wherein the bright moonlight causes fishes to stay at the bottom of the ocean, making it harder to catch;
 - Occurrence of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ)/ Easterlies, where it affects the southernmost regions of Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao resulting to the hampered fishing activities.
- Ample supplies of Local-fresh Galunggong was still observed at the Navotas Fish Port this week despite the occurrence of full moon and Easterlies. No supplies of other Local Galunggong variant like "Balsa" (*Decapterus macarellus*) and "Burot" (*Decapterus kurroides*) were recorded this week. The actual wholesale price of local-fresh galunggong "Lalaki" (*Decapterus macrosoma*) is at Php138.00/kg-Php178.00/kg.
- Imported-frozen Galunggong "lalaki" continue to be available at the Navotas Fish Port this week. Some vendors prefer selling Imported-frozen Galunggong due to its low price making it easier for them to sell.
- Prevailing wholesale prices of aquaculture commodities like Bangus and Tilapia, have remained stable due to the sufficient supplies unloaded at Navotas Fish Port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan, Laguna
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- Northern Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - China
- Market administrators of Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex continue to implement and observe precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 in accordance with the Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) protocols to ensure that vendors and consumers protected against the virus. Among these measures are mandatory wearing of face masks and face shields, as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection.
