Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Low volume of supplies for fresh-marine commodities (i.e., galunggong, tulingan, balsa, dalagang bukid, matambaka, and others) were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. This may be attributed to the bad weather condition brought by the Southwest Monsoon or "habagat" and the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ)/ Easterlies affecting major portion of Luzon and Southern Mindanao, wherein fishing activities were hampered.
- Limited supplies of local-fresh galunggong was observed at the Navotas Fish Port this week. Also, other local variant like "Balsa" (*Decapterus macarellus*) and "Burot" (*Decapterus kurroides*) were unavailable this week. The actual wholesale price of local-fresh galunggong "Lalaki" (*Decapterus macrosoma*) is at Php115.00/kg. The low prevailing price may be attributed to the low quality and smaller size unloaded compared last week.
- Imported-frozen Galunggong "lalaki" continued to be available at the Navotas Fish Port this week. The demand for local-fresh galunggong shifted to the imported-frozen galunggong as it is considered a substitute commodity.
- No changes were observed in the prevailing wholesale prices of aquaculture commodities like Bangus and Tilapia, as supplies remained stable at Navotas Fish Port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan, Laguna
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- Northern Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - China
- Market administrators of Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex continue to implement and observe precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 in accordance with the Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) protocols to ensure that vendors and consumers protected against the virus. Among these measures are mandatory wearing of face masks and face shields, as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection.
