WEEK 1 AUGUST 2-6, 2021 Prices of top fishery commodities were sustained. WEEK 2 AUGUST 9-13, 2021 The variation in the prices of fishery commodities available in the monitored retail markets depends on species' size, source area, and volume availability. WEEK 3 AUGUST 16-20, 2021 Sufficient supply of fishery commodities were observed in the monitored retail markets in the region this week. Difference in prices may have been attributed to the species' size, source area, and volume availability. WEEK 5 AUGUST 30 - SEPTEMBER 3, 2021 Despite the unfavorable weather condition this week, the fishery commodities in the monitored retail markets were sufficient. The variation in the prices of different commodities available in the market depends on the species' size, source area, and volume availability.

WEEK 1 AUGUST 2-6, 2021 Limited supply of fishery commodities and increased of prices were observed due to bad weather condition. WEEK 2 AUGUST 9-13, 2021 Prices of fishery commodities increased due to bad weather condition. WEEK 4 AUGUST 23-27, 2021 Limited supply of fishery commodities were observed in the monitored retail markets this week. Prices of the commodities were relatively higher due to unfavorable weather condition. In addition, variation in prices of fishery commodities depends on the sizes and quality. WEEK 5 AUGUST 30 - SEPTEMBER 3, 2021 Limited supplies were observed in the monitored retail markets this week and prices of fishery commodities were moderately high due to bad weather condition. In addition, prices of the commodity depends on its quality and sizes.

WEEK 1 AUGUST 2-6, 2021 Prices of fishery commodities increased due to weather inclement. WEEK 2 AUGUST 9-13, 2021 Prices of fishery commodities increased due to bad weather condition. WEEK 3 AUGUST 16-20, 2021 Price of top fishery commodities were relatively high. WEEK 4 AUGUST 23-27, 2021 Threat of pandemic continues to cause low influx of buyers in the monitored markets. Prices of aquacultured commodities (i.e. Bangus and Tilapia) as well as Local-fresh Galunggong remain relatively higher this week. In Camiguin, few vendors were observed in the region. Most of the fishery commodities in the province of Lanao del Norte increased by Php10.00 to Php20.00 per kilo as compared last week. WEEK 5 AUGUST 30 - SEPTEMBER 3, 2021 Low influx of buyers were observed in the market this week due to Covid-19 threat. Prices of top fishery commodities (i.e., tilapia, bangus, and local-fresh galunggong) were relatively high. In addition, prices may vary from its size and source area. More specifically, province of Lanao del Norte most of the fishery commodities increased its price by Php10.00 to Php20.00 per kilo as compared the last week.

WEEK 1 AUGUST 2-6, 2021 Prices of fishery commodities in the region increased due to bad weather condition. WEEK 2 AUGUST 9-13, 2021 Limited supply of fishery commodities were observed due to bad weather condition. WEEK 3 AUGUST 16-20, 2021 Due to bad weather condition, prices of fishery commodities in the monitored retail markets increased. WEEK 4 AUGUST 23-27, 2021 Low volumes of fishery commodities were observed in the monitored retail markets due to weather inclement. Relative to this, prices of fishery commodities increased this week. WEEK 5 AUGUST 30 - SEPTEMBER 3, 2021 Sufficient supply of shrimp, roundscad, alumahan(mackerel) and big-eyed scad because of the open fishing season in Davao Gulf (positive impact of 3-months Davao Gulf Closed Fishing Season). However, other fishery commodities increased its prices as compared last week due to weather inclement.

WEEK 1 AUGUST 2-6, 2021 Limited supply of fishery commodities were observed in the monitored retail markets. WEEK 2 AUGUST 9-13, 2021 Prices of some fishery commodities decreased due to abundant supply. WEEK 3 AUGUST 16-20, 2021 Prices of some fishery commodities decreased due to ample supply. However, other public markets have low supply due to bad weather condition. WEEK 4 AUGUST 23-27, 2021 Prices of fishery commodities in the monitored retail markets varied from its quality and sizes. Some public markets in the region observed to have low supply due to seasonal commodities and bad weather condition. WEEK 5 AUGUST 30 - SEPTEMBER 3, 2021 Prices of fishery commodities vary from its quality and sizes.

The following observations were gathered from market vendors and administrators for the month of August: 1. Sufficient volumes of fresh marine commodities were observed this month, more specifically Local-fresh Galunggong was noted in the 1st to 3rd week of this month of August. However, on the 4th to 5th week, minimal volumes of supply was reported due to bad weather condition brought by the occurrence of Intertropical Convergence Zone

Despite the sufficient supply of Local-fresh Galunggong, Imported-frozen Galunggong was still available but only in limited volume this month. Some of the vendors prefer selling Imported-frozen Galunggong due to its lower price, making it easier to sell.</p> <p>3. For Alumahan, ample supply was noted at the monitored retail markets this month. Most of the supplies at the monitored retail markets were still in large-sized sourced from Lucena, Quezon.</p> <p>4. No changes for the prevailing prices of Bangus and Tilapia as supplies continue to cater the demand of the consumers. Most of the supplies were sourced from Pangasinan, and Batangas, respectively.</p> <p>5. Top fishery commodities in the sixteen (16) monitored retail markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan b. Tilapia - Batangas c. Local Galunggong - Navotas Fish Port (Palawan) & Lucena, Quezon d. Imported Galunggong - Navotas e. Alumahan - Malabon Fish Port <p>6. Fluctuations in the prices of the top fifteen (15) and other commodities are influenced by a number of factors such as the commodity's size, quality, volume of supply, source area, as well as the weather condition and other natural phenomena.</p> <p>*<i>Katsuwonus pelamis</i> or Gulyasan-sliced (Php200 - Php300/kg) - Both lowest and highest prices were recorded at Valenzuela Market. The difference in the price may have been attributed to the quality of the commodity.</p> <p>*<i>Decapterus macarellus</i> or Balsa (Php130 - Php240/kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php130.00/kg was recorded in Commonwealth and Navotas markets where supplies were abundant during the 3rd week of this month, thus, were sold at a lower price. Highest prevailing price of Php240.00/kg was noted in Balintawak Market where supplies were limited in the 1st week of the month due to the bad weather condition which resulted to a higher price.</p> <p>*<i>Decapterus macrosoma</i> or Imported Galunggong "lalaki" (Php180 - Php280/kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php180.00/kg was recorded at Balintawak Market, where it is considered a primary market which offers a lower price. Highest prevailing price of Php280.00/kg was recorded at Kamuning Market, where vendors sourced their supply from nearby primary markets which makes the price high.</p> <p>*<i>Stolephorus</i> sp. or Dilis (Php100 - Php200/kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php100.00/kg was recorded in Commonwealth Market where the available supplies were directly sourced from Fish Ports, hence, lower price. Highest prevailing price of Php200.00/kg was noted at Guadalupe Market where available supplies were sourced in primary markets which resulted to a higher price.</p> <p>7. In view of the escalating COVID-19 cases and implementation of Enhance Community Quarantine (ECQ) in Metro Manila, physical price monitoring activity in the ten (10) monitored retail markets are temporarily suspended beginning 20 August 2021 (Friday) until further notice. Relative to this, daily price data and market observation are gathered via phone calls covering Top 4 Fishery commodities (i.e., bangus, tilapia, alumahan, local-fresh and imported-frozen galunggong).</p> <p>8. Low demand for buyers continues to be apparent in the monitored retail markets, especially as Metro Manila was still under Modified Enhance Community Quarantine (MECQ). As a result, vendors are selling lower volumes or limited variety of fishery commodities to ensure that all supplies are sold out by the end of the day. Also, others vendors are opening only on weekends where there is higher influx of people.</p> <p>9. Market administrators continue to implement and observe precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 in accordance with the Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) protocols to ensure that vendors and consumers protected against the virus. Among these measures are wearing of facemasks and face shields, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection, and others.</p> <p>General Observation</p> <p>Fluctuation in the prices of the top fifteen (15) and other commodities are influenced by a number of factors such as the commodity's size, quality, volumes of available supply, source area, as well as the weather condition and other natural phenomena.</p> <p>1. <i>Acanthurus olivaceus</i> or Uring (Php140.00 & Php280.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php140.00/kg was recorded at R8 where price of fishery commodities remained sufficient throughout the month. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php280.00/kg was recorded at R1 where limited supplies of fishery commodities were noted due to bad weather condition.</p> <p>2. <i>Alepes djebaba</i> or Salay Batang (Php100.00 - Php320.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php100.00/kg was recorded at R4B and highest prevailing price of Php320.00/kg was recorded at NCR.</p> <p>3. <i>Alepes vari</i> or Salay (Php80.00 & Php200.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php80.00/kg was recorded at R4B and highest prevailing price of Php200.00/kg was recorded at R4A.</p> <p>4. <i>Amblygaster sirm</i> or Tamban (Php100.00 & Php200.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php100.00/kg was recorded at NCR and highest prevailing price of Php200.00/kg was recorded at R4A.</p> <p>5. <i>Caesio</i> sp. or Dalagang Bukid (Php220.00 & Php350.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php220.00/kg was recorded at R4A and RR7.
