Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Limited unloadings of fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week, as fishing and trading operations remained hampered by the rainy weather condition brought by Typhoon "Maring" and Tropical Depression "Nando". Among the recorded commodities were tambakol, gulyasan, balsa, bisugo, betilya, dalagang bukid, lapad, pusit, tulingan and others. More specifically, minimal availability for local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) was observed this week with an actual wholesale price of Php110.00- Php120.00/kg. Wherein, two (2) brokers unloaded medium-sized of the commodity on October 12 and only one (1) broker unloaded on October 15, both were source from Northern Palawan.
- In connection to the limited availability of its local fresh variant, supplies for imported-frozen galunggong lalaki continued to be available at the Fish Port with a prevailing wholesale price of Php120.00 & Php130.00 /kg this week.
- Similarly, abundant availability of bangus was noted this week source from Pangasinan, Bulacan, and Laguna. For medium-size of the commodity, the prevailing wholesale price was recorded at Php140.00/kg.
- Meanwhile, supply for medium-sized tilapia remained sufficient this week at the Fish Port with a recorded prevailing wholesale price of Php90.00 & Php95.00/kg, majorly source from Batangas.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local-fresh galunggong - Northern Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - China
- Precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask and face shields as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against COVID-19.
