**Remarks/Market Observations:**

**The following observations were gathered from market personnel:**

- Minimal but sufficient volumes of fresh marine commodities were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. These included tambakol, gulyasan, lumut, balsa, galunggong, dalagang bukid, pusit, betilya, tunsy, and others. The minimal volume of supplies may be attributed to the trough of typhoon "Mindulle" that affects the eastern section of Southern Luzon and Visayas plus the lean fishing season for fresh marine commodities.
- Supplies of local-fresh galunggong was limited at the Navotas Fish Port this week. This resulted to a higher actual wholesale price for local-fresh galunggong (*Decapterus macrosoma*) at Php130.00-180.00/kg. Also, other local variant like "Balsa" (*Decapterus macarellus*) and "Burot" (*Decapterus kurroides*) were unavailable this week.
- Imported-frozen Galunggong "lalaki" continue to be available at the Navotas Fish Port this week due to the limited supplies of local-fresh galunggong.
- Same prevailing wholesale prices of aquaculture commodities like Bangus and Tilapia were observed as supplies remained stable and sufficient at Navotas Fish Port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Pangasinan
  - Tilapia - Batangas
  - Local galunggong- Northern Palawan
  - Imported galunggong - China
- Market administrators of Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex continue to implement and observe precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 in accordance with the Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) protocols to ensure that vendors and consumers protected against the virus. Among these measures are mandatory wearing of face masks and face shields, as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection.
