REMARKS AND OBSERVATIONS

CAR

WEEK 1-October 4-8, 2021

Low demand and supply of fishery commodities in the wet markets due to restricted GCQ health protocols imposed by the respective LGUs where in buyers find it difficult to go outside their homes. Prices of fishery commodities fluctuates from Php10.00 to Php30.00 this week. Some fish vendors sold their products at their respective homes and community/barangay. Limited number of fishery commodities entering the Cordillera Region. Since CAR is a landlocked Region, the provinces rely only on shipment coming from the nearby coastal regions. Therefore, fish commodities present and available in the 3 major markets depends on delivery.

WEEK 2-October 11-15, 2021

Still, low demand and supply of the fishery products in the wet markets due to restricted GCQ health protocols imposed by the respective LGUs where in buyers find it difficult to go outside their homes. Unsold fish products in the public market were brought to their homes and sold it thru online (by collecting orders) and deliver it to consumers.

WEEK 3-October 18-22, 2021

Low demand and supply continued to be apparent in the wet markets due to restricted GCQ health protocols imposed by the respective LGUs where in buyers find it difficult to go outside their homes. Unsold fish products in the public market were brought to their homes and sold it thru online (by collecting orders) and deliver it to consumers.

WEEK 4-October 25-29, 2021

Stable prices of fishery products/commodities were observed in the monitored markets.

WEEK 1-October 4-8, 2021

Almost all of the fishery commodities came from Dagupan City, Bolinao, Pangasinan and Sto. Tomas, La Union. Presence of imported-frozen galunggong was observed in San Fernando City Public Market with a price of Php150.00 - Php240.00 /kg while in other wet markets, local-fresh galunggong was available. The following observations were gathered from market vendors and administrators for the month of October:

- Lesser volume of supply for local-fresh galunggong were observed among the monitored retail markets this month. This may be attributed to the:
 - Lean fishing season for fresh marine commodities;
 - Cold weather condition wherein fishes tend to go to the bottom of the ocean making them harder to catch;
 - Rainy weather brought by three (3) tropical cyclones this month.
- More and more supplies of imported-frozen galunggong were observed at the monitored retail markets this month due to the limited supply of its local-fresh variant. Vendors sell imported-frozen galunggong as a substitute commodity for local-fresh galunggong. Some of the vendors prefer selling imported-frozen galunggong due to its lower price making it easier to sell.
- For alumahan, sufficient supplies were noted at the monitored retail markets this month. Most of the supplies at the monitored retail markets are still in large-sized sourced from Lucena, Quezon.
- The prevailing retail prices of Bangus and Tilapia have remained stable as supplies continued to be sufficient at the retail markets. Most of the supplies were sourced from Pangasinan, and Batangas, respectively.
- Top fishery commodities in the seventeen (17) monitored retail markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local-fresh Galunggong - Navotas Fish Port (Palawan) & Lucena, Quezon
 - Imported-frozen Galunggong - Navotas Fish Port
 - Alumahan - Malabon Fish Port

General Observation

Fluctuation in the prices of the top fifteen (15) and other commodities are influenced by a number of factors such as the commodity's size, quality, volumes of available supply, source area, as well as the weather condition and other natural phenomena.

- Scylla serrata* or Alimango (Female) (Php 600.00&700.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 600.00/kg was recorded at Region 1, Region 2 and Region 7 wherein price of the said commodity was varies from sourced, sizes and quality. Highest prevailing price of Php 700.00/kg was recorded at Region 3, Region 4B, and Region 13.
- Katsuwonus pelamis* or Gulyasan (Sliced) (Php 140.00-280.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 140.00/kg was recorded in Region 12 and Region 13 wherein the said commodity was smaller in sizes, hence, price is lower. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 280.00/kg was recorded in Region 1 and NCR wherein said commodity was larger in sizes.
- Loligo* sp. or Lumot (Php 300.00& 400.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 300.00/kg was recorded in Region 5, Region 8, Region 9 and Region 13 wherein the said commodity was smaller in size and sourced within the locality, hence, price is lower compared to Region 3, Region 4A, Region 7 and NCR.
- Loligo* sp. or Kalawang (Php 200.00& 300.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 200.00/kg was recorded in CAR, Region 4A and Region 4B wherein the said commodity was smaller in size and sourced within the locality, hence, price is lower. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 300.00/kg was recorded in Region 5, Region 6 and Region 13 due to limited supplies.
- Epinephelus* sp. or Lapu-lapu pula (Php250.00-450.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 250.00/kg was recorded at Region 5, Region 8 and Region 10 wherein the said commodity was small in sizes.
