Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Limited volumes of fresh marine commodities were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. These included tambakol, gulyasan, galunggong, balsa, tamban, espada, lapad, bisugo, lumot, pusit, turay and others. This may be attributed to the cold weather condition.
- There is still minimal volumes of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong laki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) observed at Navotas Fish Port. This may be attributed to the Closed Fishing Season (CFS) in Northeastern Palawan. This resulted to a higher actual wholesale price of Php180.00/kg (medium) this week.
- Imported-frozen Galunggong continues to be abundant at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) due to the limited supply of Local-fresh Galunggong. There is an increased of supply for Imported-frozen Galunggong at the Fish Port to cater the demand for local Galunggong as it is considered a substitute commodity.
- No changes were observed at the prevailing wholesale price of Bangus and Tilapia compared last week as supplies remained stable and sufficient to cater the demand of consumers.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
- Market administrators of Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex continue to implement and observe precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 in accordance with the General Community Quarantine -Alert level 2 (GCQ) protocols to ensure that vendors and consumers protected against the virus. Among these measures are mandatory wearing of face masks and face shields, as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection.
