Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- At Navotas Fish Port (wholesale), limited volumes of fresh marine commodities were unloaded this week. These included dalagang bukid, gulyasan, lapad, tambakol, balsa, matang baka, tamban, lumut, pusit, galunggong babae, and others. For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), no medium-sized commodity was unloaded at the fish port today. This could be due to the following reasons:
 - Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting Mindanao region;
 - lean fishing season for fresh marine commodities; and
 - closed fishing season for round scads (*Decapterus spp.*) in North-Eastern Palawan where it is mainly sourced.
- Relative to the limited availability of the local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), ample volumes of unloaded supplies were continues to be observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale). In fact, ten (10) brokers on November 29, 2021 and nineteen (19) brokers on December 02, 2021 unloaded the commodity. Meanwhile, supply for imported-frozen galunggong babae (*Decapterus russelli*) was also observed this week with a recorded prevailing retail price of Php80.00 and 82.00/kg.
- No medium-sized alumahan was unloaded at the fish port this week which might be due to the effect of ongoing implementation of closed fishing season for the commodity in Visayan sea and by the influence of cold weather condition in the country.
- In contrary, supply of medium sized bangus and tilapia continue to have ample unloadings at the fish port this week as a result prices for the said commodities were stable.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local-fresh galunggong - NA
 - Imported galunggong - China & Vietnam
 - Alumahan - NA
- In accordance with the General Community Quarantine (GCQ)- Alert level II, precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against COVID-19.
