Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- At Navotas Fish Port (wholesale), limited volumes of fresh marine commodities were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. These included tambakol, gulyasan, lapad, tamban, pusit, betilya, bilog, and others. For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), only 715 banyera (volume) were unloaded at the fish port with an actual wholesale price of Php215.00/kg (medium to large). The low supply of local-fresh galunggong and alumahan may be attributed to the Closed Fishing Season (CFS) in Northeastern Palawan and Visayan Sea which is the major source areas for the said commodities.
- Abundant supplies of imported-frozen galunggong were available at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. More and more supplies are noted due to the upcoming Christmas Holiday.
- There is still no alumahan unloaded at the fish port this week which may be due to the implementation of closed fishing season for the commodity in Visayan sea.
- The supplies of medium-sized bangus and tilapia continues to have stable unloadings at the fish port this week. This resulted to a stable prevailing wholesale prices also. Most of the supply unloaded for Bangus are large-sized as farmers extend their harvest time to achieve its marketable size for the upcoming Christmas Holiday.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local-fresh galunggong - Balabac*
 - Imported galunggong - China & Vietnam
 - Alumahan- NA
- In accordance with the General Community Quarantine (GCQ)- Alert level II, precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against COVID-19.
