**REMARKS AND MARKET OBSERVATIONS**

**CAR**

**WEEK 1-November 1-5, 2021 - WEEK 4-November 22-26, 2021**

Limited displays of fishery commodities were observed in the monitored retail markets this month.

Some fish vendors sold their products at their respective homes community/barangay.

Since CAR is a landlocked Region, the provinces rely only on shipment coming from the nearby coastal regions. Therefore, fish commodities present and available in the three (3) major markets depends on delivery.

**R1**

**WEEK 1-November 1-5, 2021 - WEEK 4-November 22-26, 2021**

Almost all of the fishery commodities came from Dagupan City, Bolinao, Pangasinan and Sto. Tomas, La Union.

It was observed that in Laoag Commercial Complex and Vigan City Public Market absence of marine fishery commodities in the market due to bad weather condition.

Presence of imported galunggong was observed in San Fernando City Public Market with a price of Php150.00 - Php240.00 /kg while in other wet markets, local galunggong was available.

Continuous implementation of health protocols (ex. no facemask and faceshield, no entry) in major wet markets in Region 1.

**R4A**

**WEEK 1-November 1-5, 2021 - WEEK 2-November 8-12, 2021**

Prices of fishery commodities especially marine species were high due to bad weather condition and low supply.

It was observed in Lucena City Public Market that there's a regular supply of marine fishery commodities and it's prices varies from sizes.

**WEEK 3-November 15-19, 2021**

In the monitored retail markets, price of bangus slightly increased this week due to transportation expenses.

The market price of imported-frozen galunggong was at Php120.00/kilo in Lucena Public Market.

**WEEK 4-November 22-26, 2021**

The market retail prices of fishery commodities were high due to increased cost of trucking (high cost of diesel/gasoline) which also caused retail price spikes.

It was observed that the price of local galunggong were also affected by low supply and some of the galunggong sold in the market were frozen (imported) (Lemery Public Market).

**WEEK 1-November 1-5, 2021 - WEEK 4-November 22-26, 2021**

Prices of fishery commodities were stable.

**R6**

**WEEK 1-November 1-5, 2021**

Few stalls were observed to have display fishery commodities during the conduct of price monitoring.

**WEEK 3-November 15-19, 2021**

Due to limited volume of supplies in the region, prices of fishery commodities increased specifically in Kalibo Public Market.

Prominent fishery commodities in the monitored retail markets were bangus (*Chanos chanos*), tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) and yellow fin tuna (*Thunnus albacares*).

**WEEK 4-November 22-26, 2021**

No presence of fish caught by dynamite fishing, rare, threatened and endangered marine species during the conduct of monitoring and inspection.

Fish that are being caught by the commercial fishing boats (ring net) were from the municipality of San Jose, Antique.

Limited fisheries commodities was observed during the conduct of price monitoring.

It was observed that there are vacant stalls in the market.

**WEEK 1-November 1-5, 2021 - WEEK 4-November 22-26, 2021**

Fishery commodities were sufficient and affordable in the monitored retail markets.

**R8**

**WEEK 1-November 1-5, 2021**

It was observed that in Catbalogan Public Market, Bangus supplied from Manila and Davao is relatively cheaper than the locally sourced.

In Guiuan Public Market, with the exception of Bangus, most of the species available in the market are sourced from Guiuan.

It was observed that there's no small-sized of Bangus available in all markets monitored

The variation in the prices of different fishery commodities available in the market depends on the species' size, source area, weather condition and volume availability.

**WEEK 2-November 8-12, 2021**

The variation in the prices of different fishery commodities available in the market depends on the species' size, source area, weather condition and volume availability.

**WEEK 3-November 15-19, 2021**

Supplies of bangus from Manila and Davao were relatively cheaper than the locally sourced variant.

It was observed in Guiuan Public Market, with the exception of bangus, most of the species available in the market are sourced from Guiuan.

**WEEK 4-November 22-26, 2021**

Price of Lato is relatively high than the other seaweeds available in the market which are cultured while the Lato is sourced in the wild.

The variation in the prices of different fishery commodities available in the market depends on the species' size, source area, weather condition and volume availability.

**R9**

**WEEK 1-November 1-5, 2021 and WEEK 2-November 8-12, 2021**

Limited supply in the wet market with moderate to high price of fishery commodities.

As per interview to retailer they prioritize the fish to be sold in the wet market even it is not fresh.

Prices of fish retailed depends on its quality and size.

During the conduct of price monitoring limited fish stalls were observed in the monitored wet markets in some Provinces of Zamboanga.

**WEEK 3-November 15-19, 2021**

Prices of fishery commodities moderately increased this week due to limited supply in the wet markets.

As per the interview with the retailers, they prioritized selling old fish stocks in the market.

During the conduct of price monitoring limited fish stalls were observed in some Provinces of Zamboanga.

**WEEK 4-November 22-26, 2021**

Abundant supply of fishery commodities especially Milkfish and Tuna in the wet market with moderate price.

Prices of fish retailed depends on its quality and size.

During the conduct of price monitoring limited fish stalls were observed in the monitored wet markets in some Provinces of Zamboanga.

It was observed that the price of pelagic fishes in Madang Public Market drops Php 10.00/kg to Php 20.00/kg due to abundant supply.																						
In other markets prices of fishery commodities increased due to limited supply caused by the bad weather condition.																						
<b>WEEK 4-November 22-26, 2021</b>																						
It was observed that there is an abundant supply of fishery commodities in the wet market despite the heavy rainfall, however, there is a price increase.

<b>The following observations were gathered from market vendors and administrators for the month of November:</b>																						
1. Minimal volumes of local-fresh galunggong and alumahan were reported among the monitored retail markets this month due to the implementation of Closed Fishing Season (CFS) at Northeastern Palawan and Visayan Sea. In addition, the cold weather condition, which pushes marine fishes to stay at the bottom of the ocean, also contributes to the low availability of the marine commodities.																						
2. Abundant supplies of imported-frozen galunggong continues to be observed at the monitored retail markets this month due to the limited supply of the local-fresh variant. According to vendors, most of the supplies of Galunggong at the fish ports are imported-frozen. Most of the vendors prefer selling imported-frozen galunggong due to its cheaper price making it easier to sell.																						
4. The prevailing retail prices of Bangus and Tilapia have remained stable as supplies continued to be sufficient at the retail markets. The stable demand also contributed to the steady retail prices of the commodities. According to vendors, unloaded supplies of Bangus this month were mostly medium-large-sized due to the nearing of Christmas Holiday. Most of the supplies were sourced from Pangasinan, and Batangas, respectively.

<b>Fluctuation in the prices of the top fifteen (15) and other commodities are influenced by a number of factors such as the commodity's size, quality, volumes of available supply, source area, as well as the weather condition and other natural phenomena.</b>																						
1. <i>Penaeus vannamei</i> or Hapon (Large) (Php 300.00&400.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 300.00/kg was recorded in Region 11, Region 12 and Region 13 wherein priced of the said commodity was varies from sourced, sizes and quality. Highest prevailing price of Php 400.00/kg was recorded in Region 5, Region 6, and Region 9.																						
2. <i>Penaeus monodon</i> or Supgo (Medium) (Php 600.00&700.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 600.00/kg was recorded in Region 3, Region 7 and NCR wherein priced of the said commodity was varies from sourced, sizes and quality. Highest prevailing price of Php 700.00/kg was recorded in Region 1, Region 7 and Region 9 wherein the said commodity are in good quality in terms of freshness and larger in size, hence, price is higher .																						
3. <i>Kappaphycus alvarezii</i> or Agal-Agal (Php 40.00-200.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 40.00/kg was recorded in Region 10 (Misamis Oriental and Lanao Del Norte) due to ample supply of the said commodities hence, price is lower. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 200.00/kg was recorded in Region 8.																						
4. <i>Katsuwonus pelamis</i> or Gulyasan (Sliced) (Php 180.00&280.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 180.00/kg was recorded in Region 5, Region 8 and Region 12 wherein the said commodity was smaller in sizes, hence, price is lower. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 280.00/kg was recorded in Region 1, Region 7 and NCR wherein said commodity was larger in sizes.																						
5. <i>Lutjanus</i> sp. or Maya-maya (Php200.00&350.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 200.00/kg was recorded in Region 5 (Camarinas Norte), Region 6 (Capiz) and Region 8 (Catalogan) wherein the said commodity was small in sizes and sourced within the locality. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 350.00/kg was recorded in Region7 (Negros Oriental), Region 9 (Zamboanga Del Sur, Zamboanga Del Norte and Zamboanga Sibugay) and Region 10 (Misamis Oriental) where supplies were reportedly large in sizes, hence, the higher price.																						
6. <i>Loligo</i> sp. or Pusit (Php100.00 - 400.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 100.00/kg was recorded in Region 11 (Davao Occidental) wherein the said commodity was sourced within the locality and smaller in size, hence the lower price. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php400.00/kg was recorded in Region 8 where supply was observed in larger size.																						
7. <i>Epinephelus</i> sp. or Lapu-lapu pula (Php300.00&450.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 300.00/kg was recorded in Region 1, Region 2 and Region 8 wherein the said commodity was small in sizes. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 450.00/kg was recorded in Region 3, Region 7 and NCR where supplies were reportedly large in sizes, hence, the higher price.																						
8. <i>Acanthurus</i> sp. or Labahita (Php 140.00&240.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 140.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B and Region 9, it was noted with ample volume of supply of the commodity as it was sourced within the locality. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 240.00/kg was recorded in Region 2 and Region 4A where supply was larger in size.																						
9. <i>Alepes vari</i> or Salay (Php 200&300/kg)-lowest prevailing price of Php 200.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B wherein the said commodity was sourced within the locality, hence the lower price compared to Region 4A.																						
10. <i>Caesio caerulea</i> or Dalagang Bukid Bilog (Php 80.00 - 280.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 80.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B due to ample supply of the commodity as it was sourced within the locality and smaller in size, hence, lower the price compared to Region 7.																						
11. <i>Caesio cunning</i> or Dalagang Bukid Lapad (Php 180.00&300.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 180.00/kg was recorded in Region 7 and Region 8 wherein the said commodity is smaller in size. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 300.00/kg was recorded in Region 11 and NCR wherein supplies were reportedly larger in size, hence, price is higher.																						
12. <i>Carangoides armatus</i> or Talakitok (Php 200.00-500.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 200.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B due to ample supply as it was sourced within the locality, hence, price is lower. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 500.00/kg was recorded in Region 4A wherein supplies was reportedly limited, larger in sizes, hence, price is higher.
