Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Limited volumes of fresh marine commodities continues to be observed at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. This may be attributed to the following:
 - Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting Southern Mindanao; and
 - Lean fishing season for fresh marine commodities;
 - Closed fishing season for galunggong (*Decapterus spp.*) at North-Eastern Palawan and for sardines, herrings and mackerels at Visayan Sea, where they are mainly sourced.
- No supplies of local-fresh galunggong "lalaki" (*Decapterus macrosoma*) and alumahan were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port this week due to the Closed fishing season at Northeastern Palawan and Visayan Sea.
- On the other hand, supplies of imported-frozen galunggong remain abundant at Navotas Fish Port due to unavailability of local-fresh galunggong.
- The prevailing wholesale price of bangus sourced from Pangasinan and Bulacan last 24 Dec. had a Php15.00/kg increment as the demand for fishery commodities increased alongside the larger size (2-3pcs) unloaded that day.
- The prevailing wholesale price of tilapia remained stable due to the sufficient supply at the fish ports.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- NA
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
 - Alumahan - NA
- Market administrators of Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex continue to implement and observe precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 in accordance with the General Community Quarantine -Alert level 2 (GCQ) protocols to ensure that vendors and consumers protected against the virus. Among these measures are mandatory wearing of face masks and face shields, as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection.
