Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Limited volumes of fresh marine commodities were unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. These included gulyasan, burot, lapad, bilog, pusit, tambakol, galunggong babae, turay, and others. For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), only 150 banyera (volume) of small-sized variant were unloaded at the fish port on 2 January 2022, noted from one broker sourced from Southern Palawan. This could still possibly be due to the following reasons:
 - Cold weather condition brought about by the Northeast monsoon, Easterlies and Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting mainly Northern Luzon and the rest of the country;
 - Closed fishing season in Northeastern Palawan where it is chiefly sourced; and
 - Low number of buyers observed in the monitored wet markets due to the end of the holiday season, alongside with the implementation of General Community Quarantine- Alert level 3 in Metro Manila, hence, decrease in demand
- On the other hand, there remains to have adequate unloading of medium-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) throughout this week. In fact, ten (10) brokers offered the commodity on 2 January 2022 and twenty-seven (27) brokers offered on 4 January 2022 at Navotas Fish Port.
- For alumahan, no medium-sized of the commodity were recorded throughout the week which might be the influence of ongoing implementation of Closed Fishing Season in Visayan sea.
- For bangus, majority of the unloaded supply was observed to be large sizes this week source from Bulacan, Pangasinan, Laguna and Zambales.
- Lastly, supply of medium-sized tilapia continued to be sufficient which resulted to the steady wholesale price of the commodity at the Navotas Fish Port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local-fresh galunggong - NA
 - Imported galunggong - China & Vietnam
 - Alumahan- NA
- In accordance with the General Community Quarantine (GCQ)- Alert level III, precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against the highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant.
