Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- At Navotas Fish Port (wholesale), limited volumes of fresh marine commodities were observed this week. These included gulyasan, tulingan, lapad, espada, dalagang bukid, pusit, lumut, and others. For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) and alumahan (*Rastrelliger kanagurta*), no medium-sized of the commodities were observed this week. The absence of the said commodities could still be due to the following:
 - Occurrence of full moon and colder weather condition due to the shearline affecting eastern section of Mindanao and Northeast Monsoon or Amihan affecting the rest of the country, hence, limited fishing operations;
 - Closed fishing season in Northeastern Palawan and Visayan sea where it is chiefly sourced; and
 - Low influx of buyers observed in the monitored wet markets due to the extension of General Community Quarantine- Alert level 3 in Metro Manila.
- Meanwhile, sufficient unloading of medium-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) were noted throughout the week. In fact, ten (10) brokers offered the commodity on 15 January 2022 and Fourteen (14) brokers on 18 January 2022 at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) with prevailing wholesale price of Php130.00/kg.
- In spite the limited availability of marine fishery commodities, stable supply of aquaculture commodities such as bangus and tilapia were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local-fresh galunggong - NA
 - Imported galunggong - China & Vietnam
 - Alumahan- NA
- In accordance with the General Community Quarantine (GCQ)- Alert level III, precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against the highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant.
