Remarks/Market Observations	<p>The following observations were gathered from market vendors and administrators for the month of December:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Supplies for fresh marine commodities, especially local-fresh galunggong and alumahan, remained minimal among the monitored retail markets due to the following reasons: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Closed Fishing Season (CFS) in Northeastern Palawan and Visayan Sea, which are major fishing ground for the above-stated commodities; Cold weather condition, which drives marine commodities to stay at the bottom of the ocean, making them harder to catch; and Onslaught of Typhoon Odette where it hampered the fishing operations in affected areas. This resulted to a higher and unpredictable retail prices at the monitored retail markets this month. For imported-frozen galunggong, abundant volumes were noted throughout the week in all the monitored retail markets for the whole month. According to vendors, only imported-frozen galunggong were available at different fish ports and most of the vendors prefer selling imported-frozen galunggong due to its cheaper price making it easier to sell. Similarly for aquaculture commodities like bangus and tilapia, stable and sufficient supplies were noted in the monitored retail this month. However, for bangus, higher prevailing retail price were observed as supplies available were large sized. This may caused by some producers delaying their harvest in time for the Christmas holiday season. Top fishery commodities in the seventeen (17) monitored retail markets are sourced mainly from the following areas: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan Tilapia - Batangas Local-fresh Galunggong - Lucena, Quezon Imported-frozen Galunggong - Navotas Alumahan - Malabon Fish Port 									

Remarks/Market Observations	<p>5. Fluctuations in the prices of the top fifteen (15) and other commodities are influenced by a number of factors such as the commodity's size, quality, volume of supply, source area, as well as the weather condition and other natural phenomena.</p> <p>*<i>Penaeus vannamei</i> or Hipon-Large (Php440 - Php600/kg), *<i>Penaeus monodon</i> or Sugpo-Large (Php950 - Php1200/kg), *<i>Loligo</i> sp. or Pusit Lumot (Php400 - Php600/kg), *<i>Acanthurus</i> sp. or Labahita (Php200 - Php450/kg).-</p> <p>6. The lowest prevailing prices of the commodities were observed during the first to second week of the month. Higher demand were noted at the monitored retail markets starting on the 3rd week until 5th week of the month due to the Christmas holiday to which resulted to a higher prevailing prices. Also, the onslaught of Typhoon Odette contributed to the higher prices due to low supplies brought by hampered fishing operations.</p> <p>7. According to vendors, higher number of buyers/consumers were observed during this month. Higher demand were observed due to the Christmas holiday, this resulted to higher prevailing prices as well.</p> <p>8. Market administrators continue to implement and observe precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 in accordance with the Alert level 2-Community Quarantine protocols to ensure that vendors and consumers protected against the virus. Among these measures are wearing of facemasks and face shields, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection, and others.</p>
