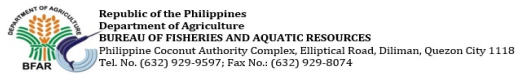

**Remarks/Market Observations:**

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors for the month of December:

- There is still limited supplies of fresh marine commodities, especially local-fresh galunggong & alumahan, unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this month due to the implementation of Closed Fishing Season (CFS) for the said commodities at Northeastern Palawan and Visayan Sea alongside the onslaught of Typhoon "Odette" in Visayas and Mindanao. Moreover, no unloaded supply of local-fresh galunggong were available during the 3rd to 5th week of the month.
- Imported-frozen galunggong continues to be abundant at the Navotas Fish Port throughout the whole month. The demand for imported-frozen galunggong had increased during the month due to the Christmas holiday season. Also, it is considered a substitute commodity as supplies for the local variant remained low.
- For aquaculture commodities like bangus and tilapia, there is a slight increased in prevailing wholesale price of Php5-10/kg especially during the 4th and 5th week of the month as higher demand for fishery commodities were observed during the Christmas holiday. Moreover, bigger size were observed for bangus as most of the supplies unloaded were medium to large-sized (2-3pcs). This may be due to suppliers delaying their time of harvest to achieved the commodity's marketable size (good size) in time for the holiday season.
- Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Pangasinan
  - Tilapia - Batangas
  - Local-fresh Galunggong - Northern Palawan
  - Imported-frozen Galunggong - China
- Market administrators of Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex continue to implement and observe precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 in accordance with the Alert-2 quarantine protocols to ensure that vendors and consumers protected against the virus. Among these measures are mandatory wearing of face masks and face shields, as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection.
