**REMARKS AND MARKET OBSERVATIONS**

**CAR**

**WEEK 1- Nov 29-Dec 3, 2021 - WEEK 5-Dec 27-31, 2021**

Fishery commodities present in the three (3) major markets depends on delivery, since CAR is a landlocked region wherein, the provinces rely only on the shipment coming from the nearby coastal regions.

In general, limited volumes of fishery commodities were observed in the monitored markets.

Low demand of fishery products in the wet markets where in buyers find it difficult to go outside their homes.

Unsold fish products in the public markets were brought to their homes and sold it thru online (by collecting order) and deliver it to the consumers.

**R1**

**WEEK 1- Nov 29-Dec 3, 2021 - WEEK 5-Dec 27-31, 2021**

Almost all of the fishery commodities came from Dagupan City, Bolinao, Pangasinan and Sto. Tomas, La Union.

Presence of Imported-frozen Galunggong was available throughout the month in San Fernando City Public Market at Php150.00/kg (medium) and Php240.00/kg (large) while in other wet markets, Local-fresh Galunggong was available.

Continuous implementation of health protocols (i.e. wearing of facemask) were observed in major wet markets.

**R4A**

**WEEK 1- Nov 29-Dec 3, 2021**

Due to inclement weather condition, low volume of supply were observed in the monitored retail markets.

**WEEK 2-Dec 6-10, 2021**

Prices of fishery commodities especially marine fishes were high in the region, which might be due to the low volume of supply caused by bad weather condition.

It was observed in Lucena City Public Market that there was a regular supply of marine fishery commodities and prices of marine fishes varies in sizes.

**WEEK 3- Dec. 13-17, 2021 - WEEK 4- Dec 20-24, 2021**

Prices of Bangus were high due to the increased of cost of trucking which influenced retail price spikes.

**WEEK 1- Nov 29-Dec 3, 2021 - WEEK 3- Dec. 13-17, 2021**

As observed, prices of fishery commodities from week 1 to week 3 of December 2021 were stable.

Variation in the prices of fishery commodities in different provinces might be due to the transportation expenses.

**WEEK 4- Dec 20-24, 2021**

Due to limited volumes of supply prices of fishery commodities were high.

**WEEK 5-Dec 27-31, 2021**

Price of fishery commodities was high due to limited supply caused by bad weather condition.

**R5**

**WEEK 2-Dec 6-10, 2021 - WEEK 3- Dec. 13-17, 2021**

Due to bad weather condition some of the fishery commodities were not available

**R6**

**WEEK 1- Nov 29-Dec 3, 2021**

No presence of fish caught by dynamite fishing, rare, threatened and endangered marine species during the conduct of monitoring and inspection.

Fishery commodities that were caught by the commercial fishing boats (ring net ) came from the municipality of San Jose, Antique.

**WEEK 2-Dec 6-10, 2021**

Limited supply of fishery commodities was observed.

**WEEK 3- Dec. 13-17, 2021**

The price of fishery products in Kalibo Public Market increased, which might be due to the strong waves brought by incoming "Typhoon Odette" all commercial fishing boats have secure and dry docked thier fishing boats.

Ample supply of bangus from New Washington and Batan were observed in the region.

**WEEK 4- Dec 20-24, 2021**

Prices of fishery products in Kalibo Public Market was stable and more number of consumers was observed during the conduct of price monitoring.

The most abundant fishery products were: Bangus (*Chanos chanos*) from New Washington and Batan, Aklan; Tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) from Kalibo and New Washington, Aklan; and Marot (*Decapterus maruadsi*) from Kalibo, Aklan.

Less supply of fishery commodities due to bad weather condition was observed in Capiz.

It was observed in Guimaras that minimal fishery commodities were available in the market due to strong wind caused by Typhoon Odette.

**WEEK 5-Dec 27-31, 2021**

The price of Fishery products in Kalibo Public Market increased due to strong waves brought by Northeast Monsoon "Amihan"; most of the commercial fishing boats cannot engage in fishing activities.

Still, the most abundant fishery products were: Bangus (*Chanos chanos*) from New Washington and Batan, Aklan; Tilapia (*Oreochromis niloticus*) from Kalibo and New Washington, Aklan; and Marot (*Decapterus maruadsi*) from Kalibo, Aklan.

**R7**

**WEEK 1- Nov 29-Dec 3, 2021**

Due to unfavorable weather condition, prices of fishery commodities were high.

**WEEK 2-Dec 6-10, 2021**

Due to unfavorable weather condition, fishery commodities are insufficient and expensive.

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**R8**

**WEEK 1- Nov 29-Dec 3, 2021**

Limited fishery commodities were observed in the market due to weather disturbance caused by the Northeast Monsoon (Amihan).

**WEEK 2-Dec. 6-10, 2021**

Price of Lato is relatively high than the other seaweeds available in the market which are cultured, because Lato is sourced from wild.

Limited fishery commodities were available in the market due to weather disturbance caused by the Northeast Monsoon (Amihan).

The variation in the prices of different fishery commodities available in the market depends on the species' size, source area, weather condition and volume availability.

**WEEK 4- Dec 20-24, 2021 - WEEK 5-Dec 27-31, 2021**

Tacloban, Ormoc, Maasin, Catarman and Guiuan Public Market PM Enumerators augmented to the Typhoon Odette Response Team (DALA; Damage and Loss Assessment) in Southern Leyte.

Minimal commodity was available in the market due to weather disturbance caused by the Typhoon Odette and the holiday season, thus the high price of available fishery products in the market.

The variation in the prices of different fishery commodities available in the market depends on the species' size, source area, weather condition and volume availability.

**R9**

**WEEK 1- Nov 29-Dec 3, 2021**

During the conduct of price monitoring limited fish stalls were observed in the monitored wet markets in some Provinces of Zamboanga.

**WEEK 2-Dec. 6-10, 2021**

Closed season and full moon was observed in the fishing ground resulting to less catch of fish with high demand in the market.

Prices of fish retailed depends on its quality and size.

Limited fish stalls continued to be apparent in the monitored markets.

**WEEK 5-Dec 27-31, 2021**

Minimal supply of fishery commodities in the wet market with high price brought about by strong wind and current in the fishing ground resulting to less catch of fish with high demand.

Prices of fish retailed depends on its quality and size.

Still, limited fish stalls were observed in the market.

This week is the start of close fishing season for Sardines in the region.

**R10**

**WEEK 1- Nov 29-Dec 3, 2021 - WEEK 5-Dec 27-31, 2021**

Prices of the primary commodities particularly tilapia, bangus and local-fresh galunggong were relatively high.

The prices of fishery commodities depends on the size's and the source area.

Less consumers/buyers were observed in the monitored markets due to COVID-19 Pandemic threat.

**R11**

**WEEK 1- Nov 29-Dec 3, 2021 - WEEK 5-Dec 27-31, 2021**

The supply of fishery commodities in the monitored markets this week were low due to bad weather condition as well as holiday season.

Meanwhile, abundant supply of Bangus, Tulingan and Tilapia were observed in the monitored markets on 2nd week of this month of December.

**R13**

**WEEK 1- Nov 29-Dec 3, 2021 -WEEK 2-Dec. 6-10, 2021**

Limited volumes of fishery commodities were observed in the monitored markets due to bad weather condition brought about by Typhoon Odette.

Consequently, lack of supply was observed in the monitored markets, especially the Island of Dinagat and Siargao.

**WEEK 3- Dec. 13-17, 2021**

Prices of fishery commodities increased due to bad weather condition brought about by Typhoon Odette.

**WEEK 4- Dec 20-24, 2021 - WEEK 5-Dec 27-31, 2021**

Still, prices of fishery commodities increased due to bad weather condition.

Some provinces were still affected of Typhoon Odette especially Surigao Del Norte and Province of Dinagat Islands that is why no report in their respective market and currently no signal.

**NCR**

**The following observations were gathered from market vendors and administrators for the month of December:**

- Supplies for fresh marine commodities, especially local-fresh galunggong and alumahan, remained minimal among the monitored retail markets due to the following reasons:
  - Closed Fishing Season (CFS) in Northeastern Palawan and Visayan Sea, which are major fishing ground for the above-stated commodities;
  - Cold weather condition, which drives marine commodities to stay at the bottom of the ocean, making them harder to catch; and
  - Onslaught of Typhoon Odette where it hampered the fishing operations in affected areas. This resulted to a higher and unpredictable retail prices at the monitored retail markets this month.
- For imported-frozen galunggong, abundant volumes were noted throughout the week in all the monitored retail markets for the whole month. According to vendors, only imported-frozen galunggong were available at different fish ports and most of the vendors prefer selling imported-frozen galunggong due to its cheaper price making it easier to sell.
- Similarly for aquaculture commodities like bangus and tilapia, stable and sufficient supplies were noted in the monitored retail this month. However, for bangus, higher prevailing retail price were observed as supplies available were large sized. This may caused by some producers delaying their harvest in time for the Christmas holiday season.
- Top fishery commodities in the seventeen (17) monitored retail markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
  - Tilapia - Batangas
  - Local-fresh Galunggong - Lucena, Quezon
  - Imported-frozen Galunggong - Navotas
  - Alumahan - Malabon Fish Port
- The lowest prevailing prices of the commodities were observed during the first to second week of the month. Higher demand were noted at the monitored retail markets starting on the 3rd week until 5th week of the month due to the Christmas holiday to which resulted to a higher prevailing prices. Also, the onslaught of Typhoon Odette contributed to the higher prices due to low supplies brought by hampered fishing operations.
- According to vendors, higher number of buyers/consumers were observed during this month. Higher demand were observed due to the Christmas holiday, this resulted to higher prevailing prices as well.
- Market administrators continue to implement and observe precautionary safety measures against COVID-19 in accordance with the Alert level 2-Community Quarantine protocols to ensure that vendors and consumers protected against the virus. Among these measures are wearing of facemasks and face shields, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection, and others.

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**General Observation**  
Fluctuation in the prices of the top fifteen (15) and other commodities are influenced by a number of factors such as the commodity's size, quality, volumes of available supply, source area, as well as the weather condition and other natural phenomena.

- Panaeus monodon* or Sugpo (Small) (Php 300.00&450.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 300.00/kg was recorded in Region 8 and Region 11 wherein priced of the said commodity was varies from sourced, sizes and quality. Highest prevailing price of Php 450.00/kg was recorded in Region 1 and Region 6 wherein the said commodity are in good quality in terms of freshness and larger in size, hence, price is higher.
- Scylla serrata* or Allimango (Male) (Php 600.00&700.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 600.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B, Region 5 and Region 9 wherein priced of the said commodity was varies sizes and quality. Highest prevailing price of Php 700.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B, Region 7 and NCR wherein the available supply was larger in size, hence, price is higher.
- Scylla serrata* or Allimango (Female) (Php 500.00&700.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 500.00/kg was recorded in Region 1, Region 7 and Region 10 wherein the said commodity was smaller in size. Highest prevailing price of Php 700.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B, Region 7 and NCR, wherein the available supply was larger in size, hence, price is higher.
- Scomberomorus commerson* or Tangigue (Php 200.00&400.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 200.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B and Region 9 wherein the said commodity was smaller size, hence, price is lower. Highest prevailing price of Php 400.00/kg was recorded in Region 7 and Region 10 wherein the said commodity are in good quality in terms of freshness and larger in size, hence, price is higher.
- Loligo* sp. or Lumot (Php 200.00&400.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 200.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B, Region 5 and Region 8 wherein the said commodity was sourced within the locality and smaller in size, hence the lower the price. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php400.00/kg was recorded in CAR, Region 4A and NCR where supply was observed in larger size.
- Acantharus* sp. or Labahita (Php 80.00-450.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 80.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B wherein the said commodity was smaller and size and sourced within the locality. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 450.00/kg was recorded in NCR wherein available supplies was lower in volume, larger in size and sourced from other region,hence, price is higher.
- Alepis djebaba* or Salay batang (Php 240.00-380.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 240.00/kg was recorded in Region 3 (Tarlac) wherein the said commodity was source within the locality and smaller in size, hence lower the price compared to NCR.
- Alepes vari* or Salay (Php 80.00-250.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 80.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B due to ample supply and sourced within the locality, hence, price is lower. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 250.00/kg was recorded in Region Region 4A wherein supplies were reportedly limited and larger in size.
- Caesio* sp. or Dalagang Bukid (Php 100.00-360.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 100.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B due to ample supply and sourced within the locality, hence the lower the price compared to NCR.
- Carangoides ferdau* or Talakitok (Php 180.00-400.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 180.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B due to ample supply as it was sourced within the locality, hence, price is lower. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 400.00/kg was recorded in Region 5 wherein supplies was reportedly limited, larger in sizes, hence, price is higher.
- Caranx melampygus* or Talakitok (Php 250.00&380.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 250.00/kg and highest prevailing price of Php 380.00/kg was recorded in Region 7 wherein prices varies from it sizes and abundant of supply.
- Cypselurus* sp. or Iliw (Php 60.00-240.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 60.00/kg was recorded in NCR wherein the available supply was supply in previous market and smaller in size, hence, price is lower. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 240.00/kg was recorded in Region 9 wherein supplies was reportedly larger in sizes, hence, price is higher.
- Elagatis* sp. or Salmon (Php 150.00-300.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 150.00/kg was recorded in Region 9 wherein the available supply was sourced within the locality and smaller in.size. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 300.00/kg was recorded in Region 11 wherein the said commodity was larger in size, hence, price is higher.
- Elagatis bipinnulata* or Salmon (Php 120.00-280.00 /kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php 120.00/kg was recorded in Region 4B wherein the available supply was sourced within the locality and smaller in.size. Meanwhile, highest prevailing price of Php 280.00/kg was recorded in Region 13 wherein the said commodity was larger in size, hence, price is higher.
