Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- At Navotas Fish Port (wholesale), limited volumes of fresh marine commodities were still observed this week. Among the fishery commodities recorded were tambakol, gulyasan, tamban, burot, balsa, bisugo, pusit, lumut, dalangang bukid, lapad, labahita, espada, and others.
- For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), only small-sized local galunggong was available sourced from Southern Palawan. No medium-sized commodity was still observed at the fish port this week. This may be attributed to the following reasons:
 - Hampered fishing operations due to bad weather condition brought about by the Trough of Low-Pressure Area (LPA) affecting Visayas, Bicol Region, Caraga, Northern Mindanao, and Davao Region; and
 - Ongoing implementation of closed fishing season in Northeastern Palawan where it is mainly sourced.
- Adequate volume of supplies for imported-frozen galunggong was still available at Navotas Fish Port this week. The demand for imported-frozen galunggong is still high due to the limited supply of its local variant.
- The prevailing wholesale prices of bangus and tilapia remained stable due to the sufficient supply unloaded at the Navotas Fish Ports.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- NA
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
 - Alumahan - NA
- Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 3 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.
