The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Limited supplies of fresh marine commodities were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. More specifically, for local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), no medium-sized of the commodity was observed at the fish port as the supply haven't regain its normal condition. Nevertheless, sufficient availability of galunggong variant (balsa, burot, babae) were still observed at the market sourced from Batangas, Quezon Province and Cuyo Pass.
- Sufficient volumes of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) was observed at Navotas Fish Port throughout the week at sustained prevailing wholesale price of Php120.00/kg sourced from China and Vietnam.
- Meanwhile, minimal supply of medium sized bangus was noted this week as majority are observed to be larger size (1-2pcs/kg), price at Php125.00 - 150.00/kg. Among the major sources are Pangasinan, Bulacan and Batangas.
- For medium size tilapia, sufficient supply are noted this week with a prevailing retail price of Php90.00/kg sourced from Batangas.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan, Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Imported galunggong - China and Vietnam
- Precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask and face shields as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against COVID-19.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of 6 February 2022, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
