Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- At Navotas Fish Port (wholesale), minimal but sufficient volumes of fresh marine commodities were unloaded this week. Among the fishery commodities recorded were tambakol, gulyasan, tulingan, galunggong, burot, balsa, batalay, bisugo, pusit, dalangang bukid, lapad, matangbaka, and others.
- More specifically, for local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), two (2) brokers offered the commodity (mixed of small to medium sizes) on February 15 at prevailing prices of Php113.00/kg & Php115.00/kg (average of Php114.00/kg), and Php188.00/kg on February 18. Supplies of local-fresh galunggong has began to increased at the Fish Port due to the lifting of Closed Fishing Season at Northeastern Palawan, which is a major source area for the said commodity, last January 31.
- Volume of supplies for alumahan remain limited at the Navotas Fish Port but is expected to increased in the coming weeks due to the lifting of closed fishing season at Visayan Sea last Feb 15.
- Despite the increasing unloadings of local-fresh galunggong, supply of imported-frozen galunggong continues to be available at the Fish Port.
- No changes were observed at the the prevailing wholesale prices of bangus and tilapia due to the sufficient and stable supplies unloaded at the Navotas Fish Ports.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- Cuyo Pass, Balabac Strait, Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
 - Alumahan - NA
- Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 2 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.
