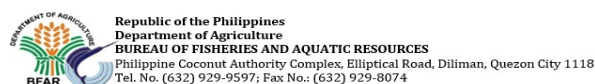

Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- At Navotas Fish Port (wholesale), sufficient volumes of fresh marine commodities were observed throughout the week. Commodities recorded were tambakol, gulyasan, bisugo, galunggong, pusit, lumut, hipon, tamban, dalagang bukid, lapad, and others. For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), two (2) brokers offered the medium-sized commodity on 19 February 2022 with an actual wholesale price of Php128.00/kg and Php170.00/kg sourced from Northern Palawan. In fact, seven hundred fifty-four (754) tubs of the commodity were recorded at Php175.00/kg and one thousand two hundred sixteen (1,216) tubs price at Php128.00/kg were unloaded at the fish port sourced from Northern Palawan.
- Still, adequate volume of medium-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) was still noted this week at the Fish Port. As a result, steady prevailing price for the commodity was still recorded this week.
- For bangus, majority of the supply observed at the fish port was still large sizes sourced from Bulacan and Dagupan this week. In addition, sufficient unloadings of medium-sized commodity was still recorded this week with a prevailing price Php130.00/kg and Php155.00/kg sourced from Pangasinan and Bulacan.
- For medium-sized tilapia, steady prevailing price was still recorded this week, as supply of the said commodity was sufficient to cater the demand of the buying public.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan, Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Imported galunggong - China and Vietnam
- Precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask and face shields as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against COVID-19.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of 19 February 2022, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.

(**) - Price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market. This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring
