**Remarks/Market Observations:**

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors for the month of February:

- More supplies of local-fresh galunggong was observed this month compared from previous months due to the lifting of closed fishing season of local galunggong (*Decapterus* spp.) at Northeastern Palawan last 1 Feb 2022. Commercial fishing in the said source area are now allowed to operate resulting to an abundant unloading of supply at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this month. There are other local galunggong variant observed at the fish port like balsa, burot and babae. Most of the supply unloaded at Navotas Fish Port are small to medium sizes. More supplies are observed to be unloaded in the coming months which will result to a lower price.
- Imported-frozen galunggong continues to be available despite the sufficient supply of local galunggong at the Navotas Fish Port. The prevailing wholesale price remained at Php120.00/kg this month.
- The prevailing wholesale prices of bangus and tilapia remained stable due to the sufficient supply at the Navotas Fish Port. Most of the supply for bangus are large-sized sourced from Pangasinan. For tilapia, the steady demand for the commodity resulted to a stable price throughout the whole month.
- Closed fishing season for sardines, herrings, & mackerel at the Visayan Sea has been lifted last Feb 15. More supplies of the said commodities are expected to be available in the coming months.
- Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Laguna, Bulacan, Pangasinan
  - Tilapia - Batangas
  - Local-fresh galunggong - Southern Palawan
  - Imported-frozen Galunggong - China
- In accordance with the General Community Quarantine (GCQ)- Alert level II, precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) are continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against the highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant.
