Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Despite the inclement weather condition caused by Tropical Depression Agaton in most parts of the country, particularly in the Visayas, Bicol region, Quezon Province, MIMAROPA, and Mindanao, lesser but sufficient unloadings of fresh marine commodities were still observed at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Commodities recorded were betilya, pusit, dalagang bukid, tulingan, tamban, chabeta, and others. Wholesale prices were observed to have a slight increased due to the higher demand brought by the observance of Lenten Season.
- Supplies for local-fresh galunggong were sufficient at the Navotas Fish Port this week. According to vendors, more and more supplies are being unloaded every week especially this April (Dagsa). Wholesale price is expected to decrease in the incoming weeks as supplies continue to increase. There are other local galunggong variants available like balsa, babae, and burot.
- Imported-frozen galunggong remained available despite the sufficient supply of local-fresh galunggong at the Fish Port. There are still demand for imported galunggong due to its cheaper price making it easier to sell.
- Alumahan continues to be available but in low volume only. This maybe attributed to the rainy weather condition brought this week.
- No changes were observed at the prevailing wholesale prices of bangus and tilapia due to the sufficient supply and stable demand at the Fish Port.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan, Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- Northern Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
 - Alumahan - Masbate
- Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.
