Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Low influx of buyers were continuously observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Nonetheless supplies of fresh marine commodities remained sufficient. Among the fishery commodities recorded were betilya, dalagang bukid, pusit, tamban, chabeta, tulingan, matambaka, and others.
- For medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), the prevailing wholesale is at Php120.00/kg sourced from Northern Palawan. The decreased in the prevailing wholesale price maybe attributed to the abundant unloadings this month (dagsa). There are also other local galunggong variants available like balsa, babae, and burot.
- Supply of imported-frozen galunggong remained available despite the sufficient supply of local-fresh galunggong at the Fish Port. Nonetheless, less buyers were observed due to the abundant supply of its local variant.
- The prevailing wholesale prices of both bangus and tilapia remained stable due to the sufficient supply at the fish port this week. Prices may vary depending on the source area, sizes and quality.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan, Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- Northern Palawan, Quezon Province
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
- Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.
