Your cooperation in disseminating the Search Guidelines to the Local Government Units (LGUs) and other concerned offices in your area of operation will highly be appreciated. As indicated in the schedule, the deadline for the submission of the regional winners for the national award will be on July 7, 2022.

2022 Department of Agriculture Search for Outstanding Rural Women "Gawad Parangal sa Katangi-tanging Kababaihan sa Kanayunan"

Guidelines

Rationale

The Department of Agriculture in the Philippines is one with the member countries of the United Nations (UN) in recognizing the important role of rural women and their valuable contribution to society.


The report of the UN shows that rural women comprise a quarter of the world's population. They work as farmers, fisherfolk, wage earners and entrepreneurs but they have less access to agricultural/fishery assets, education and markets as men. It was noted that if only they have the same access as men, agricultural/fishery production could be increased and the number of hungry people will be reduced by 100 to 150 million worldwide.

It was also reported that women account for a substantial proportion of the agricultural/fishery labor force, including informal work, and perform the bulk of unpaid care and domestic work within families and households in rural areas. They make significant contributions to agricultural production, food security and nutrition, land and natural resource management, and building climate resilience.

It is in this context that the DA has launched the DA Search for Outstanding Rural Women in the year 2003. This is in line with the implementation of the DA of gender mainstreaming of its policies, plans and programs in accordance with Republic Act 9710 otherwise known as the Magna Carta of Women (MCW). Since then, the Search has been made an annual activity of the DA Gender and Development Focal Point System (DA GFPS) until 2019.

In 2020, the Search was called off due to the imposition of community quarantine restrictions due to COVID 19 pandemic all over the country. In 2021, the DA GFPS pushed through with this activity with certain modifications with utmost consideration of observing health protocols and other regulations under the new normal scenario.

This year, 2022, the Search will be pursued again with more vigor as the threat of COVID contamination has diminished but the precautionary health protocols will still be observed. Moreover, the focus will be on searching outstanding women in rural areas with high poverty incidence.





This is to determine how the nominee has overcome the barriers prevailing in her area and the impact of her success in uplifting the lives of people in her community. This is also to see how the Department could improve the delivery of necessary services and interventions in poor areas of the country.

Objectives

- To give due recognition to rural women who have shown excellence in their fields
 of endeavor, have made outstanding accomplishments in developing the agriculture
 and fishery sectors and made significant impact in the lives of the people in the rural
 areas;
- To document the success stories of the awardees to focus public attention on them and serve as inspiration and models of women empowerment.

Scope

The search is open to all Filipino rural women who are non-government employees, currently engaged in agriculture and fisheries, and have created positive impact in the lives of the people in the rural community. They may be engaged in actual farming or fishing, processing/value-adding, marketing of agricultural inputs or products, provision of credit, micro-financing, training, education, and other entrepreneurial undertakings as individual capacities or as leaders of Cooperative/Association, Rural Improvement Clubs (RICs), and other women organizations.

Minimum Qualifications of the Nominee

- The nominee must be a bonafide resident of a rural area with high poverty incidence, such as those in the poorest of the poor provinces or in the 4th - 6th class municipalities, and is engaged in any agriculture and fishery-based activities;
- 2. She must belong to the small farmer and fisherfolk (SFF) and/or small entrepreneur category, with not more than 3 hectares land ownership and asset of not more than P 15 million (including those arising from loans, but exclusive of the land where the business is situated);
- She must not be an employee of the government, whether from the national government or local government unit (LGU), with the exception of elected Barangay Councilors (Barangay Kagawad) and volunteers such as Barangay Nutrition Scholars, Barangay Health Workers (BHW);
- 4. She must not be related by affinity or consanguinity with any current elected official in the Local Government Units (LGUs), and heads of DA offices (Director level and up) up to the second degree (except in IP Communities);

- 5. She must not have any pending case (civil, administrative, criminal, etc.) except for gender related cases;
- 6. She must not be a former national winner of the DA Search for Outstanding Rural Women or the Gawad SAKA.



Selection Process

- The DA Gender and Development Focal System (GFPS) shall disseminate the Search Guidelines to all offices of the DA and to the public through social media.
- The DA Regional Field Offices (RFOs) shall receive and evaluate the nominations
 of rural women from areas within the region and shall determine the regional
 winner. The nominations could come from the Local Government Units (LGUs),
 Government Offices (ex. DA Bureaus, and attached agencies/corporations, other
 agencies such as DAR, DENR, DTI, DOST, etc.), and Non-Government Organizations
 (NGOs).
- 3. The DA RFOs shall nominate the regional winner for the national award. It shall prepare and submit the documentation of the said regional winner. The following requirements shall be submitted online to the DA Central Office (DA GAD FPS Secretariat) based on the agreed time schedule:
 - Letter of Endorsement duly signed by the DA Regional Executive Director to the DA GAD Chairperson endorsing the nominee;
 - b. Affidavit of no pending civil or criminal case;
 - c. Profile of the Nominee (using the prescribed template);
 - d. Farm Record and Means of Verification (MOVs) for the computation of the gross income, cost of production, net income and return on investment
 - e. Success Story;
 - f. Video featuring the nominee and area of operation; and
 - g. Power Point Presentation Highlights of the Credentials vis a vis Criteria of the Search.

Submission of scrap books of the nominees is not required.

- 4. The DA GAD FPS Secretariat shall receive the nominations at this email addresses: gesi@da.gov.ph, and da_actioncenter@yahoo.com. It shall review the submissions and organize the information for the meetings of the National Technical Committee (NTC) and the Board of Judges (BOJ).
- The NTC shall undertake the technical evaluation of the nominees based on the criteria of the Search through table and field validation.
- The BOJ shall review the evaluation made by the NTC and deliberate on who among the nominees will be given the national awards.

Prizes

The prizes for the winners and incentives for the assisting agricultural extension workers will be charged to the Gender and Development (GAD) budget of concerned DA offices. These are as follows:

Special Recognition for Exemplary Contribution to Rural Agriculture

If in case the Board of Judges (BOJ) has decided to recognize a nominee who has made exemplary contribution to rural agriculture outside of the criteria of the Search, she will be given a Special Citation from the Secretary. The concerned DA RFOs that nominated her will be authorized to provide a suitable project from among the existing programs/projects in the region such as production support services (PSS), machinery/equipment/facility, and other interventions from the banner programs and special projects of the DA.
