**Remarks/Market Observations:**

**The following observations were gathered from market personnel:**

- Overall, sufficient volumes of fresh marine commodities were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port this week. Among the fishery commodities recorded were gulyasan, tulingan, matambaka, pusit, lapad, balsa, burot, tamban, babae, bilog, espada, betilya, and others.
- For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), eight (8) brokers unloaded the medium-sized commodity at fish port last 7 June and only one (1) broker unloaded last 10 June sourced from Northern Palawan at wholesale price of Php130.00/kg and Php100.00/kg, respectively. Majority of the supplies unloaded last June 10 were small in size. The price difference could be attributed to the quality, volume and sizes of the said commodity. There are also other local galunggong variants available like balsa (*Decapterus macarellus*), babae (*Decapterus russelli*), and burot (*Decapterus kurroides*).
- For imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), the prevailing wholesale price of medium-sized imported commodity decreased from Php130.00/kg on June 7 to Php120.00/kg on June 10. The Php10.00/kg decrement could have resulted from the varying volumes sold by brokers as well as the sufficient availability of local-fresh commodity and its variants (i.e., balsa, burot, babae), causing the shift in demand for local-fresh marine species.
- The prevailing wholesale prices of bangus and tilapia remained stable due to the sufficient supply at the Fish Port. All sizes were available for tilapia and bangus.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
  - Bangus - Pangasinan, Bulacan, Laguna
  - Tilapia - Batangas
  - Local galunggong- Northern Palawan
  - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
- Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.
