Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- In general, sufficient quantities of fresh marine commodities were still noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Among the fishery commodities recorded were pusit, balsa, burot, espada, lapad, tamban, turay, gulyasan, dalagang bukid, and others.
- For local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrossoma*), only one (1) broker unloaded the commodity at the fish port last June 20, 2022 with an actual wholesale price of Php175.00/kg derived from Northern Palawan. The price difference could vary depending on the quality, volume and sizes of the said commodity. There are also other local galunggong variants available like balsa (*Decapterus macarellus*), babae (*Decapterus russelli*), and burot (*Decapterus kurroides*).
- Supply of imported-frozen galunggong remained available despite the sufficient supply of its local variant. The prevailing wholesale price was steady at Php120.00/kg due to the stable supply and demand.
- No changes were observed at the prevailing wholesale prices of bangus and tilapia. This may be attributed to the stable demand of consumers plus the sufficient supply at the Navotas Fish Port. Price of bangus vary depending on the size, source area, and quality (freshness).
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan, Bulacan, Laguna
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- Northern Palawan
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
- Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of June 17, 2022, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.

(*) - Actual Price - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market. This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring.
