Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Minimal but sufficient volumes of fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Among the fishery commodities recorded were lumot, pusit, hipon, lapad, tamban, tunsoy, gulyasan, turay and others. More specifically, adequate volumes of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), were recorded this week sourced from Northern Palawan and Visayan Sea.
- In relation, minimal unloading of imported-frozen galunggong was observed this week at the fish port, as supplies of local variants were sufficient to cater the demand of the buying public.
- Meanwhile, no medium-sized alumahan (*Rastriliger kanagurta*) was still recorded this week at the fish port.
- In contrary, sufficient unloading of aquaculture commodities (i.e., bangus and tilapia) were still noted at Navotas Fish Port this week. Nevertheless, majority of the supplies for bangus this week were large in sizes obtained from Pangasinan. Moreover, other source areas of the medium-sized commodity were also recorded this week particularly from Bulacan, Laguna, and Zambales.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Pangasinan, Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local Galunggong- Visayan Sea & Northern Palawan
 - Alumahan- Not Available
 - Imported galunggong - China and Vietnam
- Precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask and face shields as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) were continuously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against COVID-19.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of July 14 & 19, 2022, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
