The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. Generally, minimal quantities of fresh marine commodities were observed at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. This may have been attributed to the occurrence of full moon on 11 August 2022 and cold weather condition brought by the Southwest Monsoon affecting the Central and Southern Luzon. Consequently, for medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (Decapterus macrosoma), only actual prices of Php140.00/kg and Php170.00/kg were recorded this week obtained from Palawan.
- 2. On the other hand, sufficient unloading's of imported-frozen galunggong were still observed at the Fish Port this week sourced from China and Vietnam.
- 3. Meanwhile, no medium-sized alumahan (Rastrelliger kanagurta) was still recorded this week.
- 4. Nonetheless, adequate supplies of bangus and tilapia were still noted at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Moreover, majority of the supply of bangus remained to be large sizes sourced from Pangasinan, Bulacan, and Laguna. Meanwhile, supply of medium-sized tilapia was sourced from Batangas.
- 6. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus Pangasinan, Bulacan
- b. Tilapia Batangas
- c. Local Galunggong- Palawan
- d. Alumahan- Not Available
- e. Imported galunggong China and Vietnam
- 7. Low influx of buyers remains to be evident this week at the Fish Port despite the relaxation of covid-19 protocols in the country. As a result, lower quality of some displayed fishery commodities were observed this week.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of August 3 & 6, 2022, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
