Remarks/Market Observations:		<ul> <li>2. Unloadings of medium-sized imported-frozen galunggong lalaki were also observed thoughout the week sourced from China and Vietnam. Other imported fishery commodities were also observed like Tulingan bilog (<i>Auxis rochei</i>), Hiwas (<i>Mene maculata</i>), Salmon (<i>Scomber japonicus</i>), Matambaka (<i>Selar spp.</i>), etc.</li> <li>3. Still, no medium-sized alumahan (<i>Rastrelliger kanagurta</i>) was recorded at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week.</li> <li>4. In contrary, sufficient unloadings of aquaculture commodities (i.e., bangus and tilapia) were recorded at the fish port this week. However, minimal increment in price of tilapia from batangas was recorded which might be attributed by the effect of fish kill in Taal lake at Agoncillo, Batangas on 9 August 2022.</li> <li>6. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas: <ul> <li>a. Bangus - Pangasinan, Bulacan</li> <li>b. Tilapia - Batangas</li> <li>c. Local Galunggong - Palawan</li> <li>d. Alumahan- Not Available</li> <li>e. Imported galunggong - China and Vietnam</li> </ul> </li> <li>7. Despite the relaxation of Covid-19 protocols in the country, low influx of buyers were continously observed at the fish port this week. As a result, quality of some fishery commodities sold at the wholesale markets were reportedly unsold stocks from previous market days.</li> </ul> <i>Note: Wholesale price data is as of August 14 &amp; 22, 2022, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off time for the covering period of this report.</i>
