The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. Sufficient volumes of fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Among the commodities recorded were hipon, alimasag, pusit, lapad, galunggong babae, balsa, tambakol, dalagang bukid, gulyasan, and others.
- 2. Consequently, sufficient unloadings of local-fresh galunggong lalaki (Decapterus macrosoma) were noted at the fish port this week. The prevailing wholesale prices were Php113.00/kg to Php183.00/kg this week sourced mainly from Northern Palawan. There are also available supplies of galunggong variants like balsa and babae sourced from Bicol.
- 3. For imported-frozen galunggong, supplies were still available at the Navotas Fish Port this week. The prevailing wholesale price remained at Php130.00/kg due to the stable demand from the consumers/buyers.
- 4. Supply of alumahan remained unpredictable and was only available on 9 September at the Navotas Fish Port this week. An actual wholesale of Php170.00/kg was recorded sourced from Masbate.

Remarks/Market Observations:

- 5. For aquaculture commodities, the prevailing wholesale price of bangus and tilapia have slight increased. This may be attributed to the high cost in petroleum prices throughout the country. Prices vary depending on source area, quality, and sizes.
- 6. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus Pangasinan, Bulacan, Laguna
- b. Tilapia Batangas
- c. Local galunggong- Northern Palawan
- d. Imported galunggong China, Vietnam
- 7. Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.
