Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Overall, sufficient quantity of fresh marine commodities were unloaded at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. More specifically, for local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), three (3) brokers unloaded the medium-sized commodity at the fish port on September 28, 2022 and one (1) broker on September 29, 2022. The recorded wholesale prices were Php180.00/kg and Php115.00/kg both were sourced from Palawan. Other fishery commodities available were tambakol, gulyasan, dalagang bukid, lapad, bolador, galunggong babae, pusit, tulingan, and others.
- Meanwhile, minimal unloading's of imported-frozen galunggong were observed at the fish port this week.
- Still, no medium-sized alumahan (*Rastrilliger kanagurta*) was recorded this week
- Meanwhile, sufficient supplies of aquaculture commodities (i.e., Bangus and Tilapia) were still noted this week at the Fish Port. On the other hand, only large and small-sized bangus were unloaded on September 28, 2022. However, two (2) brokers from Laguna offered medium-sized commodity at Php110.00/kg. Meanwhile, wholesale price of tilapia was stable at Php100.00/kg this week sourced from Batangas.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Laguna, Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local Galunggong- Palawan
 - Alumahan- Not Available
 - Imported galunggong - China and Vietnam
- Despite the relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions, minimal number of buyers were continuously observed at the Navotas Fish Port wholesale this week. As a result, some displayed fishery commodities were observed lower in quality in terms of freshness as it is leftovers from previous market days.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of September 24 & 25, 2022, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off time for the covering period of this report.
