<b>Remarks/Market Observations</b>	<p>The following observations were gathered from market vendors and administrators for the month of September:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Overall, minimal supply of fresh marine commodities was observed this month but remain sufficient as consumers continue to have low demand. The low supply may be attributed to the hampered fishing operation brought by rainy weather condition caused by Typhoon Inday, Super Typhoon Josie &amp; Karding, and Severe tropical storm Luis this month. Also, southwest monsoon or Habagat which affect Metro Manila, Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Occidental Mindoro, northern portion of Palawan including Kalayaan Islands, and the rest of the country contributed to the decreased in supply this month.</li> <li>Nonetheless, supply of local-fresh galunggong (<i>Decapterus macrossoma</i>) remained adequate among the monitored retail markets to cater the low demand from buyers/consumers this month. This resulted to a stable prevailing retail price of Php200.00/kg sourced mainly from Navotas Fish Port. In Balintawak Market, some vendors sell galunggong "balsa" as an alternative for galunggong "lalaki" as higher wholesale price were observed for the said commodity. There are also other local variants of local galunggong observed like "babae" (<i>Decapterus russelli</i>) and "burot" (<i>Decapterus kurroides</i>).</li> <li>For imported-frozen galunggong, supply remained available in most of the monitored retail markets (i.e., Trabajo, Quinta, Commonwealth, Tandang-Sora, Mega-Q, Farmers, Balintawak, Munoz, Galas, Pasig &amp; Guadalupe) this month. Some of the vendors still prefer selling imported-frozen galunggong due to its cheaper price making it easier to sell.</li> <li>Adequate supply of medium-sized alumahan (<i>Rastrelliger kanagurta</i>) was observed among the monitored retail markets this month. Difference in the prices may be attributed to the dissimilarity in the source area, and quality (freshness) of the commodity. Most of the supplies were still sourced from Lucena, Quezon, Malabon Fish Port, and Navotas Markets. Further, other variant such as hasa-hasa (<i>Rastrelliger brachysoma</i>) was also recorded.</li> <li>The prevailing retail price of bangus remained stable due to the stable demand and sufficient supply at the monitored retail markets this month. Higher demand from consumers/buyers were recorded for larger sizes of the said commodity.</li> <li>Higher prevailing retail price was observed for tilapia at Php140.00/kg this month. According to vendors, the increased in the price may be attributed to the continuous high cost of petroleum in the country. There is a Php20-30/kg price difference between live and fresh-chilled tilapia. Also, higher prices was observed for tilapia from Batangas compared to tilapia sourced from Pampanga.</li> <li>Top fishery commodities in the sixteen (18) monitored retail markets are sourced mainly from the following areas: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan</li> <li>Tilapia - Batangas, Pampanga</li> <li>Local Galunggong - Malabon &amp; Navotas Fish Ports</li> <li>Imported Galunggong - Navotas Fish Port</li> <li>Alumahan - Malabon Fish Port</li> </ol> </li> <li>Fluctuations in the prices of the top fifteen (15) and other commodities are influenced by a number of factors such as the commodity's size, quality, volume of supply, source area, as well as the weather condition and other natural phenomena. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>*<i>Atule mate</i> or Salay Batang (Php240-360/kg) -lowest prevailing price of Php240.00/kg was recorded in Balintawak Market where the available supplies were directly sourced from Navotas/ Malabon Wholesale Markets resulting to a lower price. Highest prevailing price of Php360.00/kg was noted at Guadalupe Market where available supplies were sourced from nearby primary market (Farmers), which resulted to a higher price.</li> <li>*<i>Lates calcalifer</i> or Apahap (Php300 - Php450/kg) - lowest prevailing price of Php300.00/kg was recorded in Mega-Q &amp; Calocan Markets where the available supplies were directly sourced from Navotas/ Malabon Wholesale Markets resulting to a lower price.
