The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors for the month of September:

- 1. In general, minimal but sufficient volume of supplies for fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) throughout the whole month. This may be attributed to the rainy weather condition brought by severe tropical storms and typhoons reported this month. Majority of the commodities recorded were tambakol, gulyasan, matambaka, pusit, lumot, hipon, chabeta, and galunggong variants (i.e., balsa, babae).
- 2. The supply of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong (Decapterus macrosoma) remained minimal due to the above mentioned reasons. Most of the supplies were sourced from Northern Palawan. Prices remained volatile due to the unpredictable catch per day. Abundant supply of galunggong "balsa" was observed at Navotas Fish Port this month. Some vendors sell this as a substitute commodity for galunggong "lalaki" There are also other available local galunggong variant like "babae", and "burot".
- 3. For imported-frozen galunggong lalaki, the prevailing wholesale price remained at Php130.00/kg throughout the whole month. This may be attributed to the stable and sufficient supply at the said fishport. There is still a high demand for imported-frozen galunggong due to the limited supply and high wholesale price for local-galunggong.
- 4. Supply of medium-sized alumahan remain unpredictable as supply were only available during the 1st and 2nd week with a recorded actual wholesale price of Php170.00/kg sourced from Masbate. No alumahan was observed during the 3rd to 4th week of the month which might be due to the occurrence of two (2) super typhoons "Karding" and "Josie".
- 5. For bangus, adequate unloadings were still noted this month at the Fish Port. However, minimal supply of bangus from Pangasinan was recorded this month. This resulted to a stable prevailing wholesale price of Php130.00/kg. Prices vary depending on the source area, size, and quality (in terms of freshness) of the commodity.
- 6. For tilapia, the prevailing wholesale price remain relatively high at Php100.00/kg sourced mostly from Batangas. This may be attributed to the continuous high price of gas affecting the country.
- 7. Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus Bulacan, Laguna
- b. Tilapia Batangas
- c. Alumahan Masbate
- d. Local-fresh galunggong Northern Palawan

- e. Imported-frozen Galunggong China and Vietnam
- B. Precautionary measures (e.g., wearing of face mask and face shields as well as white boots and shirts, mandatory temperature checks, and regularly scheduled cleaning and disinfection) were continously implemented by the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA) at Navotas Fish Port Complex to safeguard vendors and buyers against COVID-19.
