Remarks/Market Observations:		<ul> <li>broker unloaded medium-sized galunggong lalaki (<i>Decapterus macrosoma</i>) at the fish port this week.</li> <li>2. For imported-frozen galunggong, higher volume of supply was available at the Navotas Fish Port this week. Also, higher demand from the consumers were observed which may be caused by the limited supply of fresh marine commodities especially local-fresh galuggong due to the CFS in Northern Palawan. The prevailing wholesale price increased at Php130-137.00/kg this week.</li> <li>3. Still, no supply of alumahan was recorded at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week.</li> <li>4. The prevailing wholesale price of bangus remained at Php110.00/kg this week due to the sufficient and stable suppl at the Navotas Fish Port. Moreover, the unloaded supplies this week consist of small to medium-sized.</li> <li>5. No changes were observed for the prevailing wholesale price of tilapia at Php100-105.00/kg this week due to the sufficient supply at Navotas Fish Port. The relatively high wholesale price may attributed to the continuous high price of gas affecting the country.</li> <li>6. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas: <ul> <li>a. Bangus - Bulacan</li> <li>b. Tilapia - Batangas</li> <li>c. Local galunggong - China, Vietnam</li> </ul> </li> <li>7. Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variar in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines.
