Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Sufficient quantities of fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port this week. Among the commodities recorded were gulyasan, dorado, sapsap, dalagang bukid, bisugo, pusit, and others. Nevertheless, no supplies of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) were noted on 7 November 2022. This may be caused by the Closed Fishing Season (CFS) for galunggong species (*Decapterus* spp.) from 1 November 2022 to 31 January 2023 in Northern Palawan. Nonetheless, supplies of balsa (*Decapterus macarellus*) were reported on 11 November 2022.
- In connection, unloading's of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) and galunggong babae (*Decapterus russelli*) were still recorded this week sourced from China and Vietnam.
- Meanwhile, no supplies of alumahan were still observed at the Fish Port this week.
- For aquaculture commodities (i.e., bangus and tilapia), sufficient unloadings were still recorded this week sourced mainly from Bulacan and Batangas, respectively.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local Galunggong- Bataan, Batangas
 - Alumahan- Not Available
 - Imported galunggong - China and Vietnam
- Low influx of buyers was continuously observed at Navotas wholesale market this week. As a result, lower quality (in terms of freshness) was observed on some displayed fishery commodities which are noted to be the leftover from the previous market days. In connection, some vendors tend to offer their product in a lower or bargain price in order to gain back their capital.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of November 4 & 6, 2022, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off time for the covering period of this report.
