The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors for the month of November:

- 1. At Navotas Fish Port (wholesale), sufficient unloadings of fresh marine commodities were recorded throughout the month. Among the commodities noted were lapad, batalay, dalagang bukid, tambakol, gulyasan, alakaak, tanigue, pusit, turay, and others. Meanwhile, supplies of local-fresh galunggong lalaki (Decapterus macrosoma) remained available this month despite the implementation of Closed Fishing Season (CFS) for the commodity in Northern Palawan.
- 2. For imported-frozen galunggong lalaki (Decapterus macrosoma) and babae (Decapterus russelli), adequate unloadings were observed at the fish Port this month. Availability of other imported-fishery commodities (i.e., Tulingan bilog (Auxis rochei), Hiwas (Mene maculata), Salmon (Scomber japonicus), Matambaka (Selar spp.), etc.) were also noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale).
- 3. On the other hand, minimal supply of alumahan was recorded this month chiefly sourced from Masbate. Remarks/Market Observations:
 - 4. Nontheless, adequate supplies of bangus and tilapia were still noted at the fish Port (wholesale) this month. Moreover, majority of the supply of bangus remained to be large-sized sourced from Pangasinan and Bulacan.
 - 5. Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - a. Bangus Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - b. Tilapia Batangas
 - c. Local-fresh galunggong Northern Palawan

 - d. Imported-frozen galunggong China and Vietnam
 6. In general, low influx of buyers were continously observed at the fish port this month. As a result, quality of some fishery commodities sold at the wholesale markets were reportedly unsold stocks from previous market days.

*) - Actual Wholesale - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market. This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring
