Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Limited unloading of fresh marine commodities were observed at the Navotas Fish Port this week. Among the commodities observed were dalagang bukid, kabase, lapad, gulyasan, tambakol, pusit, dilis, bisugo, biluan, matambaka, and others. Meanwhile, only two (2) brokers were reported with supplies of medium-sized galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) with actual price of Php200.00/kg sourced from Batangas and Zambales. The minimal availability of local galunggong could be due to the implementation of Closed Fishing Season for galunggong (*Decapterus* spp.) in Northern Palawan (major source area) started last 1 November 2022.
- Similarly, no medium-sized alumahan was recorded at the fish port this week.
- On the other hand, there continuous to have sufficient unloading of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki observed this week at the fish port.
- For bangus and tilapia, adequate supplies were noted this week at the fish port. Meanwhile, higher demand for tilapia from Pampanga was observed due to its affordable price as compared to the supply from Batangas.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Batangas
 - Alumahan- Not available
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
- Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of December 22 & 30, 2022, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.

(**) - Actual Price - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market. This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring.
