Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Minimal but sufficient availability of fresh marine commodities were unloaded in Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Commodities recorded were bisugo, lumot, alimasag, tanigue, kabase, lapad, gulyasan, matambaka, tambakol, dalagang bukid, sapsap, and others.
- For local-fresh galunggong, there is an increased in the supply unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port this week especially last Feb 3 due to the lifting of Closed Fishing Season for local galunggong at Northern Palawan last Feb 1. However, the prevailing wholesale price remained high at Php230.00/kg as supplies still remained adequate but not abundant.
- The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong had a small decrement at Php140-145.00/kg this week. There is a slight shift in demand for the commodity brought by the availability of its local variant this week.
- For aquaculture commodities like bangus and tilapia, the prevailing wholesale remained at Php130-140/kg and Php110/kg due to the stable and sufficient supply at Navotas this week.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- NA
 - Alumahan- NA
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
- Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of January 27 & 30, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
