Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Limited availability of fresh marine commodities were noted in Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Among the commodities recorded were lapad, batalay, tambakol, gulyasan, pusit, bakoko, labahita, tunsoy, alimasag, espada, silinyase, salay ginto, and others. More specifically for medium-sized galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), minimal unloading of the commodity was recorded on 16 January 2023 at prevailing wholesale price of Php200.00/kg sourced from Zambales, Batangas, and Mindoro.
- Meanwhile, no medium-sized alumahan was still recorded in the fish port this week.
- For imported-frozen galunggong lalaki, adequate supplies of the commodity continued to be observed this week chiefly sourced from Vietnam.
- On the other hand, sufficient supplies of bangus and tilapia were noted this week at the fish port. On the other hand, availability of large-size bangus was still recorded due to better demand in the market.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Batangas, Mindoro
 - Alumahan- Not available
 - Imported galunggong - Vietnam
- Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of January 14 & 16, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
