Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Overall, minimal unloading of fresh marine commodities were noted in Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. This may be attributed to the constant bad weather condition affecting parts of the country. Nonetheless, some of the commodities recorded were lapad, dilis, tunsoy, banak, silinyase, salay ginto, kabase, bisugo, pusit, gulyasan, and others.
- For local-fresh galunggong and alumahan, minimal supplies were still observed at Navotas Fish Port. This may be attributed to the ongoing implementation of Closed Fishing Season for local-fresh galunggong at Northern Palawan last November 1 and for sardines, herrings, mackarels at Visayan Sea last November 15. The prevailing wholesale price is at Php200.00/kg this week.
- The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong remained at a relatively high price of Php150.00/kg this week. The high demand for the commodity brought by the unavailability of supply of its local variant caused the high prevailing wholesale price.
- Same prevailing wholesale prices were recorded for tilapia and Bangus at Php 110/kg and Php130-160/kg due to the stable and sufficient supply at Navotas this week.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- NA
 - Alumahan- NA
 - Imported galunggong - China, Vietnam
- Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of January 19 & 23, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
