Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel and vendors for the month of January:

- Ample volume of supplies of fresh marine commodities were noted at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this month. Among the commodities recorded were sapsag, tambakol, gulyasan, dalagang bukid, silinyase, alakaak, dilis, pusit, alimasag, kabase, and others.
- For local galunggong, more supplies were recorded this month compared from previous months due to the lifting of closed fishing season of local galunggong (*Decapterus* spp.) in Northern Palawan last 1 February 2023. Based on the data recorded this month, higher prevailing price were observed during the first and second week as supplies unloaded were still low unlike from the third week and fourth week wherein lower prevailing wholesale price was observed due to higher volume of supplies unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale). Supplies unloaded were mainly sourced from Palawan, Zambales, Mindoro, and Batangas.
- Also, ample supplies of alumahan were being unloaded at the Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week due to lifting of closed fishing season on sardines, herrings, mackerels in Visayan Sea last 15 February 2023. Nonetheless, unloading of supplies for the said commodity remained unpredictable as no supplies were recorded on the 3rd and 4th week of the month. Most of the supplies were sourced from Quezon Province and Masbate.
- Adequate unloading of supplies for imported-frozen galunggong lalaki were observed throughout the month. The demand for the commodity continued to be high as supplies of local galunggong variants remained ample but not abundant in the fish port. Also, some of the vendors still prefer selling imported-frozen galunggong due to its cheaper price making it easier to sell. There are also other imported commodities (i.e., Chub mackerel, and squid) noted this month.
- For aquaculture commodities (i.e., bangus and tilapia), supplies remained sufficient this month at the fish port. This resulted to a stable prevailing wholesale price at Php140.00/kg and Php110.00/kg. Majority of supplies sourced from Pangasinan were large-sized bangus due to higher demand from buyers/consumers. Most of the supplies of tilapia unloaded in Navotas Fish Port were still sourced from Batangas.
- Top fishery commodities at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local-fresh galunggong - Palawan, Zambales, Mindoro, Batangas
 - Imported-frozen galunggong - China, Vietnam

(**) - Actual Wholesale - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market. This could be due to limited volumes or no available supplies at the time of monitoring
