## The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. Minimal but sufficient availability of fresh marine commodities were observed in Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Commodities recorded were pusit, asohos, alimasag, bisugo, batalay, gulyasan, sapsap, lapad, espada, alakaak, kabase, and others.
- 2. Despite the lifting of closed fishing season for local galunggong in Northern Palawan last 1 Feb, minimal volume of supply were still unloaded at Navotas Fish Port this week. However, according to fish vendors, expect the supplies to come in this upcoming weeks. The prevailing wholesale price was at Php180.00/kg this week.
- 3. For imported-frozen galunggong, the prevailing wholesale price remained at Php140.00/kg due to the sufficient supply at the Navotas Fish Port this week. There is still high demand for the commodity due to the low availability of its local variant.
- 4. For aquaculture commodities like bangus and tilapia, supplies still remain sufficient to cater the demand of the buyers. This resulted to a stable prevailing wholesale price at Php140-160/kg and Php110/kg, respectively.

5. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:

- e. Imported galunggong China, Vietnam
- 6. Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of February 10 & 11, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
