Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- At Navotas Fish Port wholesale markets 1 & 2, sufficient unloadings of fresh marine commodities were observed this week. Commodities noted were lapad, dilis, tamban, kabase, dalagang bukid, bisugo, labahita, chabeta, batalay, bolador, matambaka, and others. This could be due to the fair-weather condition and peak fishing season in the Philippines which usually begins in March.
- Consequently, abundant supplies of local-fresh galunggong were recorded at the Navotas fish this week. Most of the supplies noted were still small to medium-sized. This resulted to a low prevailing wholesale price of Php150 & 160.00/kg this week sourced mostly from Zambales, Batangas, Palawan, Quezon and Mindoro.
- For imported-frozen galunggong, the prevailing wholesale price had a small decrement at Php130.00/kg as the demand shifted to local galunggong due to its abundant supply. According to FIQD, there are still presence of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki in the wholesale as supplies were possibly the remaining stocks from the arrived volume (24, 468 MT) of imported fish.
- The prevailing retail price of bangus decreased at Php130.00/kg as supplies were mostly sourced from Bulacan. In spite of that, supplies remained stable and sufficient to cater the demand from the buyers/consumers.
- No changes was observed the in the prevailing retail price of tilapia due to the stable and sufficient supply at the market. The prevailing wholesale price remained at Php110.00/kg today.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Batangas, Northern Palawan, Quezon Province, Mindoro
 - Alumahan- NA
 - Imported galunggong - China

Note: Wholesale price data is as of March 18 & 22, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
