Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- Ample supplies of fresh-marine commodities were reported at Navotas fish port market 3, 4, and 5 this week. Among the commodities recorded were torsilyo, malasugi, papakol, kitang, aguot, sapsap, hasa-hasa, betilya, maya, lapu pula, talakitok, labahita, bolador, loro, batalay, matambaka, saramulyete, espada, dilis, gulyasan, hipong dagat, lumot, pusit bisaya, pusit haba, pusit kalawang, burot, balsa and others. More specifically, abundant supplies of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*), as well as its other variants (balsa and burot), was noted this week.
- Despite the ample availability of local-fresh galunggong and its variants, supplies of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki remained available at the fish port this week sourced from China. The recorded prevailing wholesale price remained unchanged at Php130.00/kg. This may be due to the steady supply and demand of the commodity in the fish port.
- For aquaculture commodities (i.e., bangus and tilapia), supplies continued to be sufficient to cater the demand of the buying public. Majority of the supplies of medium-sized bangus were sourced from Bulacan and Pangasinan. Meanwhile, supplies of medium-sized tilapia were chiefly derived from Batangas.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus -Bulacan, Batangas
 - Tilapia -Batangas
 - Local Galunggong- Zambales, Batangas, Northern Palawan
 - Alumahan- Not available
 - Imported galunggong - China

Note: Wholesale price data is as of March 28, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
