The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. Abundant supplies of marine fishery commodities continued to be observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Among the commodities recorded were batalay, bolador, bisugo, dalagang bukid, espada, silinyase, dilis, kabase, and others. More specifically, for mediumsized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (Decapterus macrosoma), supplies of the commodity were still ample at a prevailing wholesale price of Php160.00/kg on 25 March 2023 and Php140.00/kg on 28 March 2023 sourced from Zambales, Northern Palawan, and Batangas
- 2. Nonetheless, unloading of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki remained available at the fish port this week sourced from China.
- 3. Meanwhile, no unloading of medium-sized alumahan was still recorded this week.
  4. Sufficient supplies of medium-sized bangus from Bulacan and Pangasinan were observed in the fish port this week. Nonetheless, supplies from Pangasinan command higher price due to bigger size (3pcs/kg) as compare to the supplies from Bulacan comprised of 3-4pcs/kg. 5. Adequate availability of medium-sized tilapia from Batangas was still noted in the fish port with recorded prices of Php110.00/kg and Php120.00/kg this week. Price difference may be attributed to the varying quality (in terms of size), as supplies with recorded price of Php110.00/kg were composed of 3-4pcs/kg and supplies with recorded price of Php120.00/kg were mostly 3pcs/kg.
- 6. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus -Bulacan
- b. Tilapia -Batangas
- c. Local Galunggong- Zambales, Batangas
- d. Alumahan- Not available
- e. Imported galunggong China

Note: Wholesale price data is as of March 25 & 28, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period

\*\*) - Actual Price - price data collected did not reach the minimum requirement of three (3) samples per commodity per market.
