Remarks/Market Observations:		 Nonetheless, supplies remained sufficient to cater the demand of buyers/consumers. Most of the supplies noted were still small to medium-sized. Supplies were mainly sourced from Northern Palawan. The prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong remained stable at Php130.00/kg this week. According to vendors, fewer supplies were noted at the fish port due to the availability of local galunggong. Most of the supplies were still sourced from China. For bangus, the prevailing wholesale price of bangus was at Php135 & 140/kg as supplies remained stable and sufficient at the Navotas Fish Port. Most of the supply of bangus were still sourced from Bulacan. Lower prevailing wholesale price were noted for tilapia at Php100.00/kg compared from previous week wherein higher price was noted due to higher demand brought by the observance of Holy week. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas: a. Bangus - Bulacan b. Tilapia - Batangas c. Local galunggong - Zambales, Batangas, Northern Palawan, Quezon Province, Mindoro d. Alumahan- NA e. Imported galunggong - China Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.
