

## The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- 1. Abundant unloading of fresh marine commodities were observed at Navotas Fish Port (wholesale) this week. Among the commodities recorded were dalagang bukid, salay ginto, biluan, maya-maya, lapad, tunsoy, kabase, tambakol, and others. More specifically, ample supplies of medium-sized local-fresh galunggong lalaki (*Decapterus macrosoma*) were noted on 18 April 2023. The recorded prevailing wholesale prices were Php160.00/kg (11pcs/kg) and Php200.00 (11-16pcs/kg) sourced from Zambales and Northern Palawan. Price difference might be influenced by the varying sizes unloaded at the fish port. Other variants such as galunggong babae, burot, and balsa were also noted.
- 2. Unloading's of imported-frozen galunggong lalaki and babae remained available at the fish port this week sourced from China. The recorded prevailing wholesale price remained unchanged at Php130.00/kg and Php90.00/kg, respectively.
- 3. Meanwhile, there continues to have adeaquate supplies of bangus and tilapia at the fish port this week. On the other hand, no medium-sized bangus from Pangasinan was noted as majority of the supplies were large-sized (1-2pcs/kg). Nonetheless, unloading of medium-sized commodity from Bulacan was recorded at wholesale price of Php130.00/kg. For tilapia, price was stable at Php100.00/kg this week sourced from Batangas.

  4. Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
- a. Bangus -Bulacan
- b. Tilapia -Batangas
- c. Local Galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan
- d. Alumahan- Not available
- e. Imported galunggong China

Note: Wholesale price data is as of April 15 & 18, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
