Remarks/Market Observations:

The following observations were gathered from market personnel:

- At Navotas fish port markets 3, 4, and 5, abundant supplies of fresh marine commodities were reported this week. Among the commodities reported this week were the following: hipong dagat, alimasag, lumot, pusit bisaya, pusit lapis, bitilya, maya, espada, bisugo, gulyasan, yellow fin, sapsap, banak, lorro, bitilya, torsilyo, labahita, dorado, talakitok, agoot, and others.
- For local-fresh galunggong, large quantities were unloaded from Northern Palawan and Zambales at Navotas fish port markets 3, 4, and 5 this week. The prevailing wholesale price is at Php130 & 160/kg this week. Supplies continues to be sufficient to cater the demand of buyers/consumers. Most of the supplies noted were still small to medium-sized.
- No changes were noted for the prevailing wholesale price of imported-frozen galunggong at Php130.00/kg this week. Lesser volume of supply were recorded at the fish port due to the abundant supply of local galunggong. Supplies were still sourced from China.
- The prevailing wholesale prices of aquaculture commodities like bangus and tilapia remained stable at Php140.00/kg and Php100.00/kg due to the sufficient supplies at the fish port. Most of the supplies were still sourced from Pangasinan, Bulacan, and Batangas, respectively.
- Top fishery commodities in the monitored markets are sourced mainly from the following areas:
 - Bangus - Bulacan, Pangasinan
 - Tilapia - Batangas
 - Local galunggong- Zambales, Northern Palawan
 - Alumahan- NA
 - Imported galunggong - China
- Market administrators continue to strictly implement precautionary safety measures in the monitored markets to ensure the consumers and vendors safety and avoid the further spread of highly infectious COVID-19 OMICRON variant in accordance with the General Community Quarantine- Alert Level 1 guidelines. Among these measures are the mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing and regular schedule of cleaning and disinfection in the markets, and among others.

Note: Wholesale price data is as of April 22 & 26, 2023, as price data from PFDA was not provided within the internal cut off of the covering period of this report.
